#### **Events**

The committee planned several successful events we'd like to highlight. They included:

Break/Networking opportunity, which was well-attended in the Natural Science Building. Zone 2 hosted a midmorning Coffee Break/Networking opportunity on December 17 in the Atrium of the MPS building. A full
