All of the previous sourcing information has been compiled into this one handy guide, which will be updated as we continue to feature new foods through 2019. 



Where's the Beef? Michigan Beef Sourcing Quick Guide

Sourcing beef locally, or even regionally, can be a significant challenge for food service buyers. The structure of the cattle and meat packing industry can make it difficult to know where your beef is coming from, and conventional beef pricing is highly competitive. Additionally, meat is highly regulated and must comply with a strict set of food safety rules. This guide is designed to provide a brief overview of important considerations and procurement strategies to help advance your local beef sourcing efforts.



Tips for local beef sourcing:

All beef intended for institutional food service must be slaughtered and processed under USDA inspection. For a full explanation of meat inspection requirements, see the Regulatory Routes to Purchasing Michigan Meat infographic from the MSU Center for Regional Food Systems.

Beef can be purchased in two primary ways:

- 1. as premade products or individual cuts from a processor or distributor, or
- 2. as a half or whole animal direct from the farm.

While buying a whole animal may offer cost savings per pound, it creates other challenges with menu planning, order logistics, and inventory management. Buying beef products à la carte from a distributor is the most common approach.

Ground product (e.g. burger patties) are generally the lowest cost. Whole muscle cuts like steaks or roasts tend to be more expensive and may require more preparation.

Blending ground beef with vegetables, beans, and pulses can help keep costs in check and enhance flavor. Many conventional ground beef products, such as patties or taco filler, contain 10-30% textured soy protein. Custom blended burgers can be made in-house or by an inspected meat processor.

There are many beef production practices, breeds of cattle, and product grades that each impact price. A large proportion of commodity ground beef actually comes from spent (or cull) dairy cows, which contributes to the low cost. Sourcing beef from a small farm may be more expensive than conventional beef products.

Procurement strategies:

- **Broadline distributor:** For many institutions, working through their prime vendor is the ideal solution. While broadline distributors are great at order fulfillment and customer service, most do not offer local beef on their product lists. Connect and refer prospective beef suppliers to your broadline sales representative to see if they are willing to add a new product or vendor.
- **Specialty distributor or food hub:** Smaller, more regionally focused distributors may be able to offer more variety when it comes to locally sourced meats. Seeking out ground products or low demand cuts may help keep costs under control.
- **Direct from USDA processor:** Some meat processors may be able to source, process and deliver locally raised beef direct to an institution. Start by contacting the USDA- inspected processors in your area to see if they offer these services.
- **Direct from farmer/ producer:** For smaller institutions, particularly those in rural areas, sourcing whole animals direct from the farm may be the best option. This approach requires close planning and coordination the farm and a USDA processor.
- **Donations:** In cattle producing areas like Montana some schools have accepted donated cattle and only pay the processing costs.

What to Consider When Sourcing Local Eggs State Licensing vs. USDA Certification and Grading

The most important consideration when buying Michigan eggs for an institution is whether a local egg producer is licensed by the State of Michigan as a Shell Egg Processor or sells its eggs to a licensed egg processor. According to the Michigan Food Law, an egg processor is an establishment that cleans, candles, grades, sorts, or packages eggs. When an egg producer also operates a processing establishment where eggs are processed for wholesale markets, an annual license is required. Small egg producers with fewer than 3,000 hens may be exempt from this rule only if they sell their eggs directly to consumers, such as at farmers markets. Essentially, any egg producer selling into wholesale or institutional markets or in settings that resell egg products to customers is required to have a licensed facility. Michigan licensing rules are based on federal regulations that can act as a baseline for states but have been expanded to include grading of the eggs as a requirement.

Additionally, many eggs also have a USDA certification and grade on the package. The USDA does not require eggs to be graded. However, the State of Michigan does, so any eggs purchased through a licensed egg farm or processor in Michigan will have a grade. The USDA has three separate grades for eggs based on the interior quality of the egg and the condition of the shell, as the chart below describes.

Grade	Egg Characteristics	Best Uses
AA	Whites are thick and firm; yolks are high, round and practically free from defects; shells are clean and unbroken	Frying and poaching, where
A	Same as Grade AA eggs, except that the whites are "reasonably" firm (this grade is most often sold in retail stores)	appearance is important
В	Whites may be thinner and yolks may be wider and flatter than eggs of higher grades; shells must be unbroken but may show slight stains	Usually used to make liquid, frozen or dried egg products



What's in a Label?

Label claims and certifications for eggs aim to communicate with consumers about how animals (and sometimes the environment) are treated throughout the production process. Whether you are ordering from a distributor or directly from a farm, it can be tough to make sense of all these claims and certifications. What do they really mean? Are they credible?

You are most likely to get what you are looking for if the label claim or certification has clearly stated principles and criteria and transparent standards, is measurable and based in science, and if an independent third party is used for verification. Review the tables below to learn more about many common labels and certifications that apply to eggs.

Label Claim	What It Means
CAGE-FREE	This claim is not third-party certified unless it is listed along with a third-party certification that requires it, such as Certified Humane or Organic. USDA grademarked eggs marketed as "cage-free" must be produced by hens housed in an area that allows for unlimited access to food and water and provides the freedom to roam within the area during the laying cycle.
FREE-RANGE, FREE-ROAMING, PASTURE-RAISED	This claim is not third-party certified unless it is listed along with a third-party certification that requires it, such as Certified Humane or Organic. VEGETARIAN-FED, VEGETARIAN DIET	Hens are not strictly vegetarians. This label indicates that hens were not fed any animal by-products. The American Vegetarian Association does offer certification, and it currently certifies the proprietary feed used by Eggland's Best. Other third-party verified claims and certifications do include similar standards.
FARM FRESH	You might consider eggs you purchase directly from a farmer or producer to be "farm fresh," but this claim is not verified or certified by an independent organization.

Bumpy, Curly, Purple & Green!

Kale can be found in a variety of textures and colors. While each variety is equally nutritious and nourishing, different attributes make them more suitable to different preparation techniques or uses. Three of the most commonly grown varieties of kale are listed in the table below.

Variety	Leaf	Flavor	Uses
Curly Kale (Common Kale)	Ruffled leaves with a fibrous stalk, typically deep green in color	Peppery and assertive with a pleasantly bitter edge	Great for all cooking uses; especially good for kale chips
Lacinato Kale (Dinosaur or Tuscan Kale)	Long, flat leaves, dark green or bluish in color with an embossed texture	Less bitter than common kale with a milder, sweeter flavor	Commonly used in pastas and soups, such as minestrone
Red Russian Kale (Ragged Jack Kale)	Greenish-purple leaves with a deep purple, fibrous stalk and an oak-shaped leaf	Mild nutty flavor that is slightly sweet and earthy	Sauté or braise mature leaves and add smaller, fresh leaves to salads

Extending the Kale Season

A hoophouse, or passive solar greenhouse, is a particular type of season extension structure typically consisting of a metal pipe frame (bent to form half-circle hoops) covered with different thicknesses of plastic, depending on the use. These structures can provide a more cost-effective way of extending the growing season compared to investing in more expensive greenhouses or other permanent structures.

A growing number of Michigan farms have turned to season extension (greenhouses, hoophouses and high tunnels) as a strategy for increasing the availability of local produce beyond traditional fresh market seasons. As a cold-hardy vegetable, kale does extremely well in season extension growing environments. The traditional fresh kale season in Michigan runs from June to October or November, but Michigan growers can make fresh kale locally available nearly year-round through season extension. So if you can't find Michigan kale through your regular distribution channels, use our "Resources for Linking with Local Farmers" to find farmers in your area who may be using hoophouses to extend the season.



The spectrum of spiciness: measuring heat levels in peppers

Domesticated in Mexico, peppers have been used to make bland dishes more appealing for thousands of years. Peppers are a hot weather crop, and they are only produced in Michigan over the summer, ready for harvest between July and October and into November by extending the season. There are hundreds of varieties of peppers, and they are generally classified as either sweet or spicy.

Peppers are unique vegetables because they contain alkaloids called capsaicinoids that make hot peppers spicy. These compounds are mostly concentrated in the lightly colored "ribs" found inside peppers. Pepper seeds do not contain any of these compounds, but they can taste spicy because they come into contact with the pepper ribs. The spiciness of peppers is typically measured on the Scoville scale, ranging from zero Scovilles (SHUs) to over 1,000,000! Sweet peppers such as bells, sweet bananas and pimentos typically rate at or below 100 SHU, hotter peppers like serranos are in the range of 5,000 to 15,000 SHUs, and some of the hottest peppers, such as the ghost pepper, can rate from 800,000 to over 1,000,000 SHUs. Due to the extreme spiciness of these peppers, they are mostly used in very small quantities. Sweet peppers, mainly bell pepper varieties, make up the majority of pepper production in Michigan, and are suitable for eating raw and do not come with the risk of a burnt tongue.

What Makes a Fruit a Stone Fruit?

The more common varieties of fruit that fall into the category of "stone fruits" include peaches, plums, apricots and nectarines. (Cherries, the Cultivate Michigan featured food of winter 2016, are also considered a stone fruit.) Stone fruits are most easily identifiable by their hard inner pit, which in some cases resembles a stone. These stones are referred to as drupes in the horticultural world and act as a protector for the seeds within them.



Storage Tip:

To reduce the risk of pathogen growth, maintain cut leafy greens at 41°F or lower during storage and display.



So Many Possibilities for Your Salad

Salad greens are vegetables harvested for their leaf and petiole, the stem portion of the leaf. The 2009 Food Code states that "leafy greens" include iceberg lettuce, romaine lettuce, leaf lettuce, butter lettuce, baby leaf lettuce, escarole, endive, spring mix, spinach, cabbage, kale, arugula and chard. Asian leafy vegetables such as pac choi and tatsoi are also gaining popularity as salad greens in their baby leaf and microgreen forms.

When Are Different Greens Available in Michigan?

Some greens are more heat- or cold-tolerant than others. For example, lettuce does not tend to grow well in hot weather, so Michigan-grown lettuce is scarce in July and August. Most salad greens can be harvested in Michigan all winter long using season extension techniques such as hoophouses.

Storage Tip:

Fresh tomatoes may be frozen, whole, chopped or sliced. Wash tomatoes and remove the stem, store in a tightly closed plastic bag, and then freeze up to eight months.

Nutrition Tip:

The lycopene in processed tomatoes (canned, sauce and ketchup) is actually more readily available to the body than that found in raw tomatoes. Heating breaks down the plant's cell walls, making the lycopene more accessible to the body.

Fact:

In 2015, Michigan was the 10th largest producer of fresh tomatoes and the fourth largest producer of processing tomatoes in the United States.

What is an heirloom tomato?

An heirloom tomato is an open-pollinated variety that has been passed down at least 50 years through several generations in a family or an ethnic, religious, or tribal group, or was commercially introduced before 1940.

Some tomatoes now marketed as "heirloom" are actually a cross between two different heirlooms (crossed on purpose or by nature), or are a cross between an heirloom and a hybrid tomato. The cross is then stabilized over several generations so they become open-pollinated.

Heirloom tomatoes come in various colors, including purple, pink, yellow, orange, striped and marbled, and unusual shapes and sizes. Heirloom varieties can be especially tasty, perfect for introducing children, staff members, patients and visitors to institutions to the many flavors of tomatoes.

Many heirloom varieties have a long harvest season, unlike some hybrids that were bred for a heavy crop ripening at the same time for ease of commercial harvest. Heirloom tomatoes can help provide your institution with a steady supply throughout the growing season.

Storage Tips:

Winter squash can be stored in a cool, dry place for up to three months. Squash stores best with part of the stem still attached to help retain moisture. Once cut open, store squash wrapped in plastic wrap in the refrigerator for up to four to five days.



A variety for every taste and every use!

Available fresh September through November, Michigan-grown winter squash has mild-flavored flesh and a fine texture. The most popular winter squash varieties – recommended for freezing as well as fresh use – include acorn, butternut, Delicata, Hubbard, pumpkin and spaghetti. The table below describes the most popular squash varieties, highlighting the appearance, flavor and key nutrients for each.

One of the most enjoyable experiences a person can have is biting into a sweet, juicy, freshly picked apple. However, because of the nature of the fruit and its small harvest window in Michigan, apple growers and packers use state-of-the-art storage systems throughout the winter months and into the following spring to maintain the same level of freshness as the day the apples were picked. Controlled atmosphere storage (CAS) facilities around the state are packed to the brim each fall harvest and slowly emptied over the course of the year in response to demand. How long Michigan apples are available from storage depends on the size of the season's harvest. The "controlled atmosphere" (lower oxygen and higher carbon dioxide levels) reduces the fruit's metabolic activity and its sensitivity to ethylene, which can hasten fruit softening and color change. By putting the apples to "sleep", or in a state of hibernation in storage, peak quality and freshness can be maintained for months.

Find Frozen and Dried Michigan Cherries All Year Long!

Though they can be purchased year-round in their frozen and shelf-stable dried forms, all cherries in Michigan are harvested in July and August. Their growing season is so quick, in fact, that only about 60 days pass from cherry blossom bloom to fruit harvest.

Cherries are machine-harvested into water to protect the fruit. The machines shake the cherry trees firmly yet gently, moving in the shape of a star to ensure that they impact all the stems at just the right angle to release the fruit. The cherries land on an angled canvas tarp and drop into large tanks that hold 1,000 pounds of cherries and 1,000 pounds of water. After harvest, the fruit remains in the tanks for several hours while the water is constantly flushed out and exchanged for cool water, which removes the field heat from the cherries.

At the processing plant, the fruit gets washed, sorted and pitted. Then it is frozen for use as a frozen or dried cherry product. Did you know that dried cherries are made from frozen cherries? Frozen cherries are thawed, infused with syrup and processed in a dryer to make the sweet treat Michiganders know and love.

What is IQF? IQF stands for individually quick frozen. Cherries that go through this process generally have nothing added to them, so IQF products are a great way to enjoy this unsweetened, delightfully tart fruit.
