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Resolve to have a great 4-H year

As we start to think ahead to the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

Resolve that:

1. Club meetings will start and end on time.
2. Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
3. All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
5. Fun will be included in each meeting.
6. A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
7. The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
8. New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H questions.
9. The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
10. Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.

4-H Capitol Experience is now recruiting for 2019 participants! This annual statewide program, occurring March 17-20, helps prepare youth for active citizenship by focusing on civic engagement and public policy.

More than 100 teens from around the state converge on Lansing to experience state government in action and learn how they can influence policy issues. Participants interact with legislators, state agency staff, and other resource people to learn how policy is made.

Attendees will leave the program having a great understanding of the responsibilities of a citizen, be able to identify different aspects of a policy issue that may affect individuals and communities, and know potential careers in public policy.

Scholarships available for increasing your skills and knowledge!

Ongoing training to improve skills and knowledge in both youth development and specific projects are important for 4-H volunteers. Did you know that to help with this effort, 4-H Council has a scholarship for volunteers who attend educational workshops? Volunteers can be reimbursed for fees up to 50 percent at educational workshops such as Kettunen Center workshops, 4-H Exploration Days, and more! Prospective Volunteers

All prospective volunteers must go through the Volunteer Selection Process in its entirety prior to being accepted as a volunteer. Any adult who is involved in a club activity on an ongoing basis (more than 4 meetings) must go through this process. One of the steps to become a new 4-H leader is to complete an interview and orientation with 4-H staff. If you know someone who wants to volunteer, the next scheduled interview dates are 1/23 for time slots available between 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. Interviews take approximately 30 minutes. Orientation is 1/23 at 3:30 p.m. and will take about 1 & 1/2 to 2 hours. Call the Extension office to RSVP for a time slot.
