

Tractor Supply Company Fall Paper Clover Campaign

Help support our county program at the Tractor Supply Company stores in Charlotte and Delta Township from October 9-20, 2019!

Every fall and spring, 4-H joins forces with Tractor Supply Company to hold the Paper Clover Campaign, where individuals can purchase a \$1 (or more) paper clover at check out at local TSC stores to support the 4-H program. Local 4-H programs receive 70% of the funds raised at local stores and 30% goes directly to support 4-H at the state and national level.

These funds supported a total of \$2,810 for opportunities in Eaton County during the 2018-2019 program year. Funds supported the 4-H participation fee scholarship for 30 individual youth and 8 families in the 2018-2019 year, double the support provided in the previous year, and youth who attended 4-H Exploration Days, 4-H Creative Arts Workshop, 4-H Capitol Experience, and the National 4-H Agri-Science Summit. We need your help to continue to offer these great opportunities for youth! The 2018-2019 campaigns raised \$1,534.30, which fell short of our needs for last year. You can help by sharing information about the campaign, helping your club by hosting a booth at either TSC stores and talking to the public about 4-H, and purchasing a clover at either of these stores!

Michigan 4-H Youth Leadership & Global Citizenship Spectacular

The Michigan 4-H Youth Leadership and Global Citizenship Spectacular embodies Michigan 4-H's mission to make the world a better place through collective youth power. Attending the annual conference will help you become an outstanding leader who approaches life with your head, heart and hands open to new ideas, interesting people, and diverse cultures. Come to the 2019 4-H Spectacular and be part of the movement that has YOUth leading the way!

The workshop features a wide variety of incredibly fun sessions focused on youth leadership, civic engagement, global citizenship, international cultures, life skills, career exploration and workforce preparation. Sessions for the workshop have been planned, and will be led, by youth and adult volunteers and MSU Extension staff.

The 4-H Youth Leadership & Global Citizenship Spectacular will be held September 21-22, at the Kettunen Center in Tustin, Michigan. This workshop is open to current and aspiring leaders and volunteers, ages 12 and up (by Jan. 1, 2019).

Participants must register for the 4-H Spectacular by September 9. Register at <u>https://</u> <u>events.anr.msu.edu/spectacular19/</u>. The registration fee (\$85.00) includes superb lodging, four delicious, home-cooked meals, conference resources and some great surprises!

In order to participate in the 4-H Spectacular, youth participants must also enroll (or re-enroll) in Michigan 4-H for the 2019-2020 4-H program year (which begins on September 1), and pay the \$20 4-H participation by September 15, 2019. Contact the 4-H staff at the <u>MSU Extension office in your county</u> to learn about the availability of scholarships that may reduce or completely cover your registration fee for this event.

Michigan 4-H represented by two youth at 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships

Michigan 4-H was represented by two youth in the <u>4-H Shooting Sports National Championships</u> held in Grand Island, Nebraska, June 23 through June 28.

The 4-H Shooting Sports National Championship is open to youth across the country to compete and present their skills in compound archery, recurve archery, air rifle, air pistol, smallbore rifle, smallbore pistol, shotgun, muzzle loading and hunting.

"We're really proud of our two 4-H'ers who attended this national event," said Laura Quist, Michigan 4-H Shooting Sports coordinator with MSU Extension. "Competing at the national level takes a lot of commitment, time and effort."

Preparation for youth to attend the national championships begins months in advance of the competition. The youth selected to participate put in considerable practice time in their chosen events in order to compete at their best.

The Michigan 4-H youth that attended and competed are:

- Joe Balkema, a 15 year-old Kalamazoo County 4-H'er, who received a gold medal in 3-D archery and third place overall in compound archery.
- Jackson Sokel, a 16 year-old Monroe County 4-H'er, who competed in shotgun.

"Congratulations again to these two youth on a great contest," continued Quist. "We also want to acknowledge and thank the parents of these 4-H'ers who helped to make their success possible."

Youth Reenrollment in 4-H

Reenrolling youth in 4-H is a simple two-step process:

- Complete your reenrollment in 4HOnline. Instructions and the link to access 4HOnline can be found at <u>https://www.canr.msu.edu/resources/</u> <u>michigan 4 h enrollment</u>. A few tips for completing this step:
 - DO NOT create a new account if you have ever enrolled in 4HOnline. You will be required to log into your existing account and complete enrollment there.
 - There is an option to reset the password if you have forgotten it, which will email a temporary password to the email on file. If you need to check which email you used or do not have access to the email in 4HOnline, please contact the MSU Extension office.
 - All signatures on the authorization page must be completed correctly. This
 includes typing in Youth First and Last Name in the "Member Signature"
 boxes and Parent/Guardian First and Last Name in the "Parent/Guardian
 Signature" boxes. Make sure the check boxes that are above the signature
 boxes are also checked. Any variations or errors in these steps will result in
 you needing to recomplete the entire page of signatures before the youth is
 approved as a member. Media release is optional.
 - If any information has changed, please update the information (including contact information, club changes, or project changes) and then click "submit" on your profile for approval.
 - Only youth and volunteers that have been accepted through the Volunteer Selection Process will reenroll.
- Submit your 4-H participation fee. The fee is \$20 per youth with a maximum of \$60 per family (scholarships available by contacting the Extension office). Please contact your club administrative leader for payment instructions as some clubs prefer fees paid to the club and some prefer fees paid directly to the Extension office. Payments are not accepted online.

You will receive an automated email from 4HOnline when you submit your profile and a second email once your profile has been accepted and marked active once the participation fee has been received at the Extension office. Members and volunteers are not in 4-H until their profile has been accepted and marked active by the Extension office.

Volunteer Reenrollment in 4-H

Reenrolling as a volunteer in 4-H is a two-step process this year.

- 1. Complete your re-enrollment via 4HOnline. 4HOnline instructions and guides and a link to the database can be found at <u>https://www.canr.msu.edu/</u> <u>resources/michigan_4_h_enrollment</u>. IMPORTANT: The code of conduct has been updated this year in 4HOnline. Please read it so you are familiar with the expectations of you as a volunteer.
- 2. Submit your background check using the information sent via email from 4HOnline.

Please complete the background check by November 15, 2019 along with your 4-H Online reenrollment. Volunteers who do not complete both steps by November 15 will be required to recomplete the Volunteer Selection Process in its entirety prior to being accepted as a volunteer.

4-H Age Guidelines:

Michigan 4-H Youth Development programs are open to young people aged 5-19 years of age. "4-H age" is determined by a young person's age as of January 1 of the current 4-H program year, which runs from September 1 through August 31. Cloverbuds are 4-H age of 5-7 and complete non -competitive projects; 4-H members are a 4-H age of 8-19. For the 2019-2020 program year:
