Our Partner



Fall Extension Conference attendees are challenged to make a financial donation to the Food Bank Council of Michigan, our official partner organization for the 2020 FEC Community Service Challenge. The mission of the FBCM is to create a food secure state through advocacy, resource management, and collaboration among stakeholders and Michigan's unified food bank network. The Food Bank Council of Michigan will distribute 100% of the donations it receives from our FEC Challenge to it's member Food Banks and Food Providers.

Each member food bank has a geographic service region in which they provide food resources to communities. Based on their region, some member food banks have supporting distribution warehouses. The member food banks and their supporting warehouses are able to take large donations of food. The local emergency food providers (agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries and shelters) then "shop" the regional food bank or warehouse to acquire food to meet the needs for their own community programs and services.

2,982 hunger-relief agencies and programs distributed 205,177,172 pounds of food and water.

HOW THE POINT SYSTEM WORKS

For this year's Challenge, we'll have 15 teams, with attendees from each district forming 14 District teams, and 1 team made up of campus-based staff.

In order to keep the competition fair, points earned by each team will be weighted against the number of staff that are housed in each District (or on Campus). Each teams total points earned during the challenge will be divided by the number of staff in the District (or and Campus) to ensure an equal and fair competition.



Team #	\$ donated to agency of choice (1 point per \$1.00)	Number of staff on team	Percentage of staff who participate in FEC Community Service Challenge & bonus scoring	Total point score (Points x bonus) / number of staff on team
Α	\$420.00 = 420 points	34 staff members	55% (Double points bonus!)	420 X 2 = 840 840/34 = 25 points
В	\$1000 = 1000 points	113 staff members	34% (no bonus)	1000/113 = 9 points
С	\$900 = 900 points	55 staff members	100% (Quadruple points bonus)	900 X 4 = 3600 3600/55 = 65 points

Team C wins the Challenge with 65 points!

Use the "MSU-E" code when you donate

You get to choose whether you'd like your donation to the Food Bank Council of Michigan to be directed towards the fight against hunger in Michigan at the state, regional or county level!

When you submit your donation on the FBCM website, you'll see a field labeled "*Please type your county or code below*:" (for the Virtual Field Drive) or "*I want my donation to be dedicated:*" (for the COVID-19 Relief Fund Drive). Enter the code **"MSU-E"** into this field to ensure that your donation is counted as part of the FEC Community Service Challenge.

If you would like your donation to be applied to a Food Bank or Food Provider serving a specific county, enter the code: **"MSU-E + XXX County"**. You can choose to support **ANY** county in the state with your donation, and still earn points for your own District/Campus team!
