



# What Kind of Grub do I Have?


Common grubs can be distinguished by looking at the raster.



The European Chafer, June Beetles, False Japanese Beetles, and Japanese Beetles have differently shaped Palidia and Anal Slits.



The European Chafer has a Y-shaped anal slit and a zipper shaped palidium.



June Beetles have Y-shaped anal slits that are less clear than European Chafers and a parallel line palidium.



False Japanese Beetles have a U-shaped anal slit and a palidium shaped like a long, narrow V.



Japanese Beetles have a U-shaped anal slit and a palidium shaped like a short, wide V.

These by examining the raster of your grubs with a hand lens, you can tell these three types of grubs apart in the field.
