To subscribe to the html version of Agnet, send an email to: [listserv@listserv.uoguelph.ca](mailto:listserv@listserv.uoguelph.ca)  
Leave the subject line blank.

In the body of the message type: subscribe agnet-L yourfirstname yourlastname (for example: subscribe agnet-L John Doe)

AgNet will send you a confirmation email, to make sure you really want to be on the list. You have to click on a web link to activate the newsletter. After that, you receive daily updates and articles on ag related news.

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
