FARM TO ECE:

Sowing the Seeds for Healthy Futures in **MICHIGAN!**



The Michigan Farm to ECE Network was partially supported by a grant administered by the Association of State Public Health Nutritionists (ASPHN) and funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) from November 2020 to June 2023. Farm to Early Care and Education (ECE) is an innovative evidencebased approach that gives young children increased exposure and access to local produce, opportunities to learn about nutrition and agriculture, and hands-on learning through gardening. ECE refers to preschools, child care centers, family child care homes, Head Start, and more.

WHY FARM TO EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION?

According to the CDC, **1 IN 2 CHILDREN** ages 1-5 do not eat a daily vegetable and **1 IN 3 CHILDREN** ages 1-5 do not eat a daily fruit.

Farm to ECE **INCREASES** children's consumption of fruits and vegetables by **ONE DAILY SERVING**. Farm to ECE programs can **INCREASE THE SUCCESS** of Farm to School programs by **DECREASING PLATE WASTE** by as much as **66%**.
