Application Instructions

Applications should include the following components:

- A one-page resume outlining the applicant's experience and qualifications
- A brief statement (one to two paragraphs) stating your interest in this project
- Examples and samples of past projects, preferably of a similar size and scope
- Proposed plan of work, inclusive of project stages and milestones
- Proposed project budget inclusive of fees for professional services, hours, administrative services, travel costs, supplies.

Please limit application to a maximum of three pages, excluding resume and samples of past design work. Criteria of selection will include quality of candidates and examples of past projects.
