



- Nearly 30 million people live in low income areas with limited access to supermarkets.
- In low income communities and communities of color, disparities exist in the quality, variety, quantity, and price of healthy foods.
- 2.1 million households do not own a vehicle and live more than one mile from the nearest supermarket.

SCALING THE PROJECT - VEGGIE VAN

The **YMCA Veggie Van** mobile farmers market makes weekly stops in urban neighborhoods throughout Grand Rapids to distribute fresh, low cost produce in neighborhoods where access is limited, including:

- Community Centers
- Schools
- Senior Living Centers



- Low income apartment complexes
- Workplaces as part of Corporate Wellness programs


