
Shared vision that emerged:

- The agenda of the AAP and partners needs to be Africa-focused and Africa-led

AAP Framework and Priority Areas



Partnership Principles

- 1. A mutually beneficial relationship with a shared vision
- 2. Based on trust, mutual respect, transparency, empathy and accountability.
- **3**. Collaboration must be sustainable beyond an initial grant cycle, with a view toward long-term collaboration
- 4. Founded on clarity of purpose; clear contribution to society.
- 5. Based on engagement of partners at the beginning, in which objectives, activities, resource allocation plans are developed jointly.
- 6. A governance structure that reinforces accountability, a structured work plan and metrics

Illustrative achievements in 2016

- 1. Formation of AAP management team
- 2. Advisory Board (5 from Africa, 2 from MSU)
- 3. Formation of a AAP Secretariat in Africa (Dr. Richard Mkandawire, Director)
- 4. Communications: (monthly AAP newsletter, website, digital portal)
- 5. Co-sponsoring events (e.g., session at 2016 World Food Prize, African Green Revolution Forum, Mali delegation visit to MSU, Desmond Tutu event)
- 6. 2016/17 Call for Proposals
- 69 proposals received, 11 accepted so far
- Awardees to be showcased at upcoming AAP Launch, July 2017

AAP Launch: *Putting Vision into Action Together*

July 19-22 Dar es Salaam, Tanzania

- Builds on mission statement of AAP to bring about positive change in Africa through meaningful, equitable partnerships
- Demonstrates AAP commitment to develop best practices in research and apply them in collaboration with African institutions
- Africa-centered program featuring prominent African leaders from higher education institutes, research bodies, NGOs, donors and the private sector.
- Participatory sessions that will: define landscape and vision; share

experience and practice; propose new ideas for collaborative implementation; and identify resources to bring vision into action.

AAP Portal: Virtual Partnership

- Networking tool: Searchable database of AAP and partner network memberships
- Resource hub: for dissemination of publications and research-inprogress; grant and fellowship opportunities; innovative approaches to exchange of knowledge and practice
- Workspace Commons: research groups can collaborate virtually and engage with policy makers and practitioners around AAP priority areas



Year Two: AAP Fellows Program

- Fellowship Clusters: 12-month program to bring scholars together to develop and disseminate research
- Four broad thematic areas: sustainability, policy, South-South, health
- **Short-term residencies** twice during fellowship: once at MSU and once in Africa
- Outcomes would include joint dissemination of results and proposals for future collaboration and funding
- Program allows for additional fellowship programs: practitioners; post-docs; think-tank model
- Fellows would **collaborate virtually** through the AAP portal
