This project teaches youth to read a recipe and learn a little about chemistry.

Uncooked Grape Jelly

For this Recipe you will	need
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	2	cups	of	luke	ewai	m	water
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☐ 1-6-ounce can of frozen unsweetened grape juice concentrate

☐ 1 box powdered pectin

☐ 3 ½ cups sugar

Slowly mix the pectin into the lukewarm water in a two-quart mixing bowl. Stir the mixture constantly until the solid pectin is dissolved in the lukewarm water. Let the mixture stand for 45 minutes. Stir the mixture occasionally, but do not beat it.

Thaw the frozen can of grape juice by placing the can in cold water. When the juice is thawed, pour it into a one-quart mixing bowl. Stir into the juice 1 ¾ cups of sugar. Mix thoroughly. Not all of the sugar will be dissolved. Add the remaining 1 ½ cups of sugar to the dissolved pectin mixture. Stir this pectin-sugar mixture until the all sugar is dissolved. Mix the juice mixture with the pectin mixture. Stir the mixture constantly until all of the sugar is dissolved.

Pour the liquid grape juice, pectin, and sugar mixture into freezer containers or can-ning jars. Leave 1/2 –inch headspace. Cover with a tight lid. Let the mixture stand at room temperature until it is set or solid (should take up to 24 hours). Freeze or refrigerate the grape jelly.

World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute applications due April 1

As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to **AT MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY** be part of the solution. On May 6, youth will join

virtually to become inspired and prepared as the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

Attendees will have the opportunity to share their ideas related to global food security with experts and other Michigan youth while learning how university faculty and staff members, researchers and students are working to address world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the April 1 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a two- to five-page research paper about a developing country and how it is affected by one of 20 key factors that impact food security. At the online event, youth will present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts. They will also participate in an interactive session with global challenge experts to learn more about topics related to global food and food security.

The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be considered as possible delegates to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, or virtually, in October. 
