Make any updates to your family profile by clicking <u>Edit Family</u>. It is *very* important to have accurate and up-to-date contact information!

Under your family profile is a list of individual members; click <u>Edit</u> to the right of each name - this will take you to that individual's profile.

Scroll to the bottom of the screen and click Enroll for 2019-2020

Review all information and update as necessary; click <u>Continue</u>. Do this for each page.

Choose your club/clubs, click Add Club and then Continue.

Choose your project area for each club, click <u>Add Project</u> and then <u>Continue</u>. At this point, you can click <u>Submit</u>.

For youth members: status will show as "Pending" until their 4-H participation fee has been received by Grand Traverse County 4-H staff. Once this is received, staff will review the youth's profile and, if all information is completed, approve their profile and move it to "Active" status.



Having an "Active" 4-H profile is imperative for youth to participate fully in all 4-H activities!

Michigan 4-H represented by two youth at 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships

Michigan 4-H was represented by two youth in the <u>4-H Shooting Sports National Championships</u> held in Grand Island, Nebraska, June 23 through June 28.

The 4-H Shooting Sports National Championship is open to youth across the country to compete and present their skills in compound archery, recurve archery, air rifle, air pistol, smallbore rifle, smallbore pistol, shotgun, muzzle loading and hunting.
