About 4-H

4-H is the largest youth development organization in Michigan. 4-H is found in almost every county across the nation and enjoys a partnership between the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), state land-grant universities (in our case MSU), and local county governments.

4-H is about youth and adults working together as partners to design and implement activities and events. Positive youth development is the primary goal of 4-H. The project areas serve as a vehicle for members to learn and master life skills, with the ultimate goal of 4-H members gaining the skills necessary to successfully live and lead in a diverse and changing world.

Participation in 4-H has many positive outcomes for youth. 4-H participants are more likely to contribute to their communities and be civically engaged, earn higher grades, and develop more healthy habits than other youth who are not involved in 4-H (Learner et al., 2015).

4-H Age

4-H is open to <u>all</u> youth from age 5 to 19. 4-H age is determined by the member's age as of January 1st of the current program year (program years run September to August). Youth ages 5 to 7 are considered Cloverbuds. The cloverbud program is designed as an introduction to 4-H and is focused around participation instead of competition.

4-H Volunteers

At the core of Michigan 4-H, and critical to the success of its youth, are the volunteers who give their time and talents to grow 4-Hers. These volunteers serve in a number of capacities: some choose to help at camp, some may teach workshops or lead clubs, while others chaperone events or lend their professional skills. As they provide hands-on guidance and real-world experience, these volunteers also offer young people another crucially important element – a healthy adult role model who helps to grow their confidence and ignite their dreams for the future.

To ensure the safety of 4-H youth, MSU Extension has a through screening and selection process for volunteers. This includes an application, background and reference checks, an interview, and online training modules. 4-H Parents

4-H is considered a family program and parents are encouraged to participate with their own children. Please remember that many hands make light work! Any time or help you are able to pitch in ensures the job gets done and everyone is able to have an enjoyable experience. For the safety of all our participants, parents cannot work directly with other youth or attend any overnight activities until they complete the MSU Extension volunteer selection process (see link above under 4-H volunteers section).

4-H Enrollment Information

4-H has year-round enrollment, meaning you can join at any time during the program year (which runs September through August). Please be aware that many events have deadlines in order to participate, so it is best to enroll as soon as possible. 4-H enrollment opens each September and members must reenroll annually. 4-H enrollment is handled through 4-H Online. Please visit <u>https://v2.4honline.com/</u> to submit your enrollment. Keep in mind, you are not considered a 4-H member until you have enrolled in 4-H Online AND your enrollment has been approved by the Extension office.

Club contact information can be found on pages 5-7. Please contact the Extension office if you need assistance finding a club.

Costs Involved

Joining 4-H is FREE! Some clubs and experiences may charge a club due, project fee, or other registration/experience fee. This is a great question to ask before you join a new club or sign-up for an activity. The Gratiot County 4-H council provides scholarships to help offset the cost of attendance for many workshops and events. We do <u>not</u> want finances to be a barrier to participation. Please contact the Extension office for additional scholarship and funding opportunities when needed.

Gratiot County 4-H Clubs

There are several different types of clubs through which 4-H programs can be delivered. 4-H members may be involved with more than one club. Members in a community club will often join project clubs or SPIN Clubs, or members will join multiple community clubs that focus on different project areas. The table below shows a listing of currently registered community and project clubs in Gratiot County.

Community Clubs:

Involve members of a variety of ages and interests. These clubs typically meet year-round and include business meetings and educational activities that all members attend. They may also hold specific project meetings throughout the year led by a project leader and attended by members with specific project interests.

Project Clubs:

Focus on one specific project area. These clubs may meet year-round or seasonally and aim to teach members knowledge and skills in one specific area.

SPIN Clubs:

SPIN clubs focus on one particular area of interest and are short-term in length. They typically meet for 1-2 hours per week for around 6 weeks. SPIN club offerings vary throughout the year, so stay tuned to the newsletter and social media for information on upcoming SPIN club opportunities.

Gratiot County 4-H Committees

Gratiot County 4-H has a couple of committees that help to guide certain project areas and events. Committees have open meetings and participation is highly encouraged. Serving on a committee is also a great leadership opportunity for youth members and adult volunteers.

Gratiot County 4-H Council:

4-H council provides a common meeting ground for youth and volunteers to work with 4-H staff. Made up of Gold volunteers and teen representatives, this group provides guidance and direction in developing and conducting 4-H programs that meet the needs and interests of youth in Gratiot County. They oversee scholarships and recognition activities, provide educational workshops, and promote 4-H throughout the county. Meetings are typically held the last Monday of the month, 7pm at the Extension Office. All clubs are encouraged to send representatives to this meeting to have a voice in shaping our county program.

Gratiot County 4-H Horse Developmental:

This committee provides support in planning and conducting 4-H horse and pony programs in Gratiot County. They organize horse camp, open horse show, and the selection of delegates for the State 4-H Horse Show. Membership is made up of one adult and one youth representative from each 4-H horse club. Attendance by anyone active in the horse project is encouraged.

Gratiot County Fair for Youth

The Gratiot County Fair for Youth (GCFFY) is a great opportunity for 4-H members to showcase the projects they have been working on all year. GCFFY is a separate entity from MSU Extension/Gratiot County 4-H. Youth do not have to exhibit at the fair to participate in 4-H, nor do youth have to be in 4-H to exhibit at the fair.

GCFFY is spearheaded by the fair board. Fair board typically meets at 7pm on the first Thursday of the month at the Bill & Grace Vanderbeek Fair Office at the fairgrounds. Meetings are open to the public.

The fair is typically held the last week of July/first week of August (2023 dates are July 29-August 5). The answers to many fair questions can be found by looking in the fair book. This is available on the GCFFY website and includes the fair schedule, fair rules, camping, livestock regulations, and entry information. Fair specific questions should be directed to the fair office. Contact information is below.
