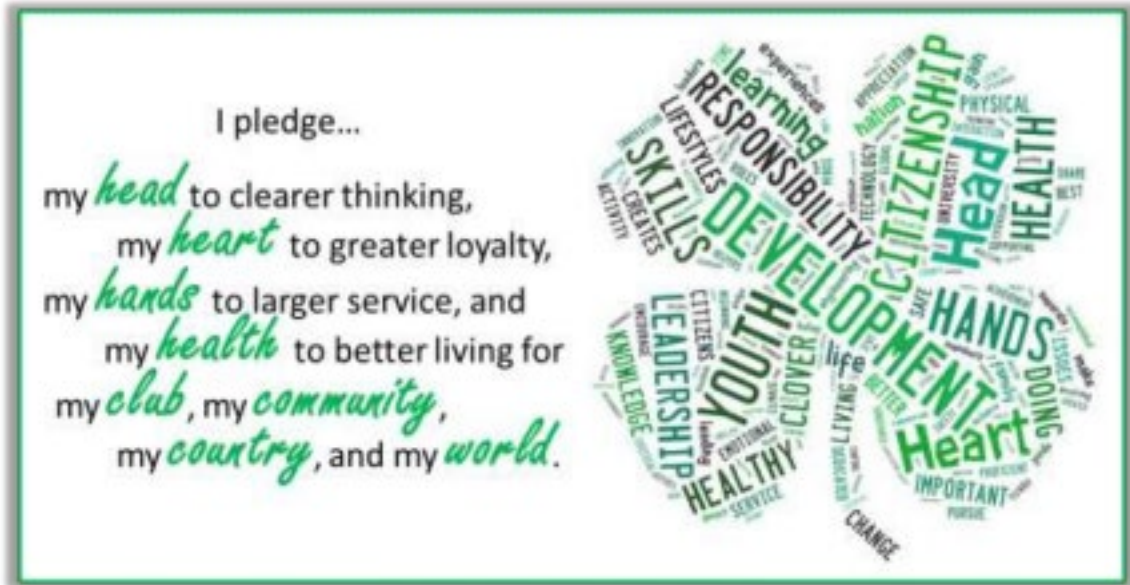


Hillsdale County 4-H Awards Program

PURPOSE: To create an awareness of opportunities and awards offered to youth.

AN AWARD: Recognition given an individual who has made a specific accomplishment. In many program areas, the award is also an opportunity to learn. This adds a dimension of responsibility to the individual and others. Two important things to remember about awards:

1. It is an honor to receive an award. It is honorable to accept and carry out the responsibility of the award.
2. An award is recognition of the things you have achieved in the past. After you have received your award, it is time to set new goals for tomorrow.

ELIGIBILITY: Any 4-H member. It is necessary to have the administrative leader write a recommendation and sign the awards application. The leader and parent are encouraged to assume an active supporting role in helping 4-H members complete their application.

DUE DATE: Wednesday, December 15, 2021.

WHO SELECTS: Hillsdale County 4-H Council Awards Committee.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE HILLSDALE COUNTY 4-H AWARD FORM

4-H PROJECT SUMMARY: HAND WRITE OR TYPE

NOTE: If you are applying for county medals, please list on page 9 those projects you would like to receive a medal for.

4-H AWARD PROCESS

The award process is the tool used to select county award recipients. All Hillsdale County 4-H members have the opportunity to receive one or all of the following awards during their 4-H career.

AWARD DESCRIPTIONS

4-H Young Person's Achievement Award: Any 4-H member 9-11 years of age is eligible. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H Career. Honorable Mentions considered. Sponsored by the 4-H Council.

Susan Trausch Memorial Award for Crafts: Any 4-H member 9-11 years of age is eligible. Members must have participated as a 6–8-year-old in a craft project to be eligible for this award. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Sponsored by the Country Get-A-Longs 4-H Club.

County Award Medals for Intermediate Age Youth: Any 4-H member 12-14 years of age is eligible. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than two medals in a calendar year. Members must have at least two years' experience in the project area. List specific projects (Example, Beef, Swine, Achievement, and Foods & Nutrition). Sponsored by a variety of national donors and the 4-H Council. See attached list of 4-H County Medals. **DO NOT LIST BY CATEGORY.**

County Award Medals for Older Youth: Any 4-H member 15 years and older is eligible. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than two medals in a calendar year. Members must have at least two years' experience in the project area. List specific projects (Example: Beef, Swine, Achievement, and Foods & Nutrition). Sponsored by a variety of national donors and the 4-H Council. See attached list of 4-H County Medals. **DO NOT LIST BY CATEGORY.**

Please note: Capitol Experience and Washington D.C. Trip are two separate awards:

Capitol Experience (March 20 – 23, 2022): This award is for youth 4-H age 13 (as of Jan. 1, 2022) and up. You must be 4-H age 14 or older when participating in Capitol Experience. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. 4-H Capitol Experience is an annual 4-day conference that helps prepare youth for active citizenship by focusing on civic engagement and public policy. You will experience state government in action and learn how you can influence policy issues. Participants interact with legislators, state agency staff, lobbyists, and other resource people to learn how policy is made. Simulations and activities are incorporated to reinforce and apply what is learned about government.

The total cost of Capitol Experience is approximately \$385.00. Your share of the cost will be \$100.00 plus some out-of-pocket meals. The 4-H Council will cover the remainder of the cost (approximately \$285.00). Participant share must be paid by February 13, 2022. Transportation to the event is the responsibility of the family.

Washington D.C. Trip – Citizen Washington Focus (CWF) (June/July 2022): This award is for youth 4-H age 13 (as of Jan. 1, 2022) and up, you must be 4-H age 14 or older when attending CWF. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career.

This is a weeklong trip to Washington D.C. to attend the Citizen Washington Focus program. The trip tentatively includes a night in Gettysburg to visit the National Museum and Civil War Battle Fields, as well as

visits to the Capitol, Mount Vernon, Arlington National Cemetery, Presidential and War Monuments and much more.

The cost of the CWF trip will be \$2,000 plus 6 meals in route and on delegate day. The Michigan 4-H Delegation will travel by charter bus to D.C. If selected, the 4-H Council will cover \$1,600 of the cost. Your share will be \$400 and all out-of-pocket expenses. Participant share must be paid in January 2022.

National 4-H Congress (late November 2022 in Atlanta, Georgia): This award is for youth 4-H age 14 years and older. NOTE: You must be 15 yrs. old by 4-H age at the time of the trip. It is to attend the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career.

The total cost of the Atlanta, Georgia National 4-H Congress trip is approximately \$1,800.00 - \$2,000.00 (which includes airfare). If selected, the 4-H Council will cover \$1,600.00 of the costs. Your share will be the remainder of the fee and other out-of-pocket expenses. Participant share must be paid in the summer of 2022.

4-H Hillsdale County Key Club Award (*Highest award a 4-H member can receive*): Any 4-H member 15 years of age and older may apply. Members must have completed three years of club work, taken at least two 4-H projects, served as a teen leader, participated in three districts (state sponsored) and/or state 4-H events. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career.

"I Dare You" Leadership Award: Any 4-H member who is a Junior or Senior in high school is eligible for this award. The award is presented as recognition of excellence in character and well-balanced personal development qualities of constructive leadership. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Sponsored by the 4-H Council and the American Youth Foundation.

Frank Proctor Memorial Award: Any 4-H member who is a Junior or Senior in high school or a college freshman that is an active teen leader and/or club officer may apply. Members must have at least three (3) consecutive years in any one project or combination of project areas. This award is given to an overall outstanding 4-H youth. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career.

Frank Proctor was a former Hillsdale businessperson who supported building youth leadership skills and community involvement.

Susan Trausch Memorial Award for Rabbits: Any 4-H member that is 15 years and older is eligible. Members must have at least three (3) consecutive years in the rabbit project. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Sponsored by the Country Get-A-Longs 4-H Club. Application for this award **must be handwritten**.

Susan Trausch was a long time 4-H Project and Administrative Leader for the Country Get-A-Long 4-H Club.
