

Back Again This Year! Beef Carcass Class



- · Exhibitors must drop off their carcass cattle to MSU Meat Lab on July 20, time announced in the Cloverleaf
- · The carcass cattle will be transported to MSU Meat Lab the morning after drop-off.
- •The cattle will be slaughtered and hung on at the MSU Meat Lab. The cost of processing is \$150 for kill fee and \$25 for transportation to Meridorf Meats. Meridorf Meats will pay for the processing fee to MSU Meat Lab, so the buyer will pay \$175 in addition to the carcass purchase price.
- ·The carcasses will be graded on July 29, time announced in the Cloverleaf. The Youth Exhibitors and Parents are able to watch and learn about grading.
- We will know the results on the day of the grading. The results will be shared with the exhibitor once the
- Grand and Reserve Champions must sell during the Large Animal Auction. Grand and Reserve Champions are
 the only carcasses that will sell in the auction. Selling a carcass exhibit will count as a trip through the ring.
- The placings will be announced at the Beef Show on Monday, August 1, 2022.

Apply for a 2022 4-H State Award!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards (13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.

New training required for 4-H volunteers

Since 2013, Michigan State University (MSU) has required all MSU employees and volunteers conducting business on behalf of the university to report child abuse and other harm to children. To help MSU Extension volunteers better understand the reporting expectations, a new online learning module titled "Child Abuse Reporting Protocol" has been developed. The module can be completed in 10-15 minutes.

All 4-H volunteers are required to complete this training in the upcoming year. Deadlines are as follows:

- New volunteers must complete the module as part of the screening and onboarding process.
- Current 4-H volunteers due for annual compliance and background checks on April 1 or later must complete the training before their 2022 annual compliance date.
- Current 4-H volunteers due for annual compliance and background checks in February or March must complete the training before their 2023 annual compliance date. However, these volunteers are encouraged to complete the training prior to this date.

To review the training, 4-H volunteers may either:

- Log into Volunteer Central and complete the module through the system. Within Volunteer Central, the module will be visible on either the screening dashboard (applicants) or the annual compliance dashboard (volunteers). Once completed, Volunteer Central will log this as "completed".
- Check with your local 4-H program coordinator to determine if they will be hosting a local training or meeting to review and discuss the material. For trainings conducted by MSU Extension professionals, attendance will be recorded in Volunteer Central on your behalf.

Pi is a very old number. It's importance has been recognized for at least 4000 years. Pi (rather than some other Greek letter like Alpha or Omega) was chosen by British mathematician William Jones in 1706 probably as an abbreviation of periphery, and became standard mathematical notation roughly 30 years later. The numbers to the right of the 3 never repeat in a pattern. Thanks to computers, we now know more than the first six billion digits of pi.
