Compete

New this year is an animal science skillathon/master stockman contest. Any youth ages 8 to 19 regardless of project area and membership may compete in this contest. The contest will consist of around 25 knowledge and skill based items per species (horse, beef, dairy, sheep, swine, poultry, cavy, rabbit, dog, cat, and goat). Youth may compete the species they choose as individual skillathon contests. Medals will be awarded for each species skillathon. Youth may also choose to compete in the master stockman contest, which includes all of the species. Master stockman champions will receive a belt buckle and there are placing medals as well.

Youth are encouraged to form teams of three to four to compete in the team competition. Team competition scores are based on individual master stockman scores and a team challenge. The team challenge is a scenario that the youth work through together to find a solution. Medals will be awarded to all placing team members.

Join the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase!

MSU Extension is thrilled to partner again in 2023 with the <u>Michigan State Fair</u> on an exciting program for Michigan youth: the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase. This statewide showcase provides a virtual platform for youth across Michigan to exhibit their work in all project areas and apply for up to \$10,000 in scholarships. Any Michigan youth ages 5-19 is encouraged to participate; 4-H membership is not required.

Registration for this event is now open! The diverse array of <u>classes</u> celebrate all the projects and programs in which youth have developed skill and mastery. This includes livestock and animal showmanship classes, as well as still exhibits, educational projects and more.



There is no cost to participate and youth may engage in as many classes as they wish by <u>submitting project photos and videos</u>. **Be sure to submit your entries by the registration deadline of August 1.** Project evaluation will occur before the start of the Michigan State Fair so that winners can be announced at the event which occurs August 31 – September 4.

In addition to the opportunity to showcase their skills, recognize their accomplishments and receive constructive feedback for growth and development, participants in the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase will also have the opportunity to apply for \$10,000 in scholarships. Going home: Biosecurity tips for animals that went to the county fair

<u>Michigan State University Extension</u> offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home after the fair has ended.

- Keep animals that were at the fair separate from animals that were not for 28 30 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that was at the fair.
- Throw away any feed or hay that was at the fair.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
 - Obvious pain or discomfort
 - Decrease in appetite and water intake
 - Fever
 - Lethargy
 - · Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure
 - Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes
 - · Overall weakness

Care of animals after the fair is just as critical as their before-fair care. Exhibited animals were exposed to new animal populations and fair goers, and most likely experienced a lot of stress during their time away from the farm. By practicing these biosecurity steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.



Bill Wheeler Memorial Scholarship Nomination Form

This form can be used to self-nominate or nominate another for the Bill Wheeler Memorial Scholarship

To be eligible for scholarship consideration one must:

- 1. Have exhibited an animal project at the Ingham County Fair for at least 3 years (including current year).
- 2. Be a graduate of the current year and be currently exhibiting in the livestock project area at the Ingham Co. Fair.
- 3. Plan to attend a college, university, or trade school upon completion of high school.
- 4. Expenses will be reimbursed up to \$500 when eligible receipt(s) are received.

NOTE: Up to 6 (six) scholarships will be awarded.

4-H members are eligible to win this scholarship no more than one time.
