Rabies - in general, it affects the central nervous system including any of these: personality change, biting, depression, anorexia.

Feline Distemper- fever of 104 F to 105 F, severe depression, weight loss, dehydration, loss of appetite, and intense desire for water, vomiting and diarrhea.

Feline Leukemia- Chronic infection, anemia, depression, anorexia, fever, weight loss.

Rhinotracheitis & Calici: sneezing, depression, loss of appetite, discharge from the eyes and nose, fever, and ulcers in mouth.

Feline Infectious Peritonitis(FIP): bloated abdomen, respiratory difficulties, vomiting or diarrhea, weight loss, anoxeria, fever, anemia.

Skull, upper mandible, lower mandible, scapula, humerus, radius, ulna, elbow, sternum, rib cage, fibula, tibia, femur, hip joint, pelvis, tail vertebra (coccigial), sacral vertebrae, lumbar vertebrae, thoracic vertebrae, cervical vertebrae

TIE BREAKER QUESTIONS: carpal bones, metacarpals, phalanges, phalanges, metatarsals, tarsal bones, patella (knee cap).

Rabies: in general, central nervous system including any of these: personality change, biting, depression, anorexia.

Feline Leukemia: Chronic infection, anemia, depression, anorexia, fever, weight loss.

Approximately 4 - 8 months. Uterus and ovaries.

 Approximately 4 8 months. Testicles.
- 4. Can you give a cat acetaminophen? Why/why not?

 No, it causes anemia.

External: fleas, lice, mites, ear mites, ticks.

Internal: roundworms, hookworms, tapeworms.

6. How do cats get tapeworms?

By eating fleas, and/or by eating the intestinal tract of a rodent or rabbit.

7. How do cats get roundworms?

-From their mother at birth, -From nursing, -From rodents or rabbits.

8. What is FIP? What are the symptoms?

Feline Infectious Peritonitis. Symptoms are: bloated abdomen, respiratory difficulties, vomiting or diarrhea, weight loss, anorexia, fever, anemia.

9. Can cats get heartworm disease?

Yes, but it is not treated. A cat is a dead end host. Heartworms cannot reproduce in a cat.

10. What is FIV? How is it detected?

It is Feline Immune Deficiency Virus. Detected by a blood test.

- 11. Name 4 symptoms of a sick kitten or cat.
 - -Extreme or prolonged lethargy.
 - -A dull, patchy coat that sheds heavily
 - -Loss of appetite for several days in a row
 - -Severe, prolonged diarrhea
 - -Red, watery eyes
 - -Nasal discharge
 - -Acute swelling or small lumps that increase in size on the cat's body
 - -Repeated vomiting
 - -Repeated, persistent coughing & sneezing

 A high-protein, high-fat diet. For example: a high quality commercial cat food.
 Should not feed: raw eggs, raw fish, raw meat, large quantities of liver, dairy products, dog food as a main diet.
