Go to http://mi.4honline.com and enter the email and password you created last year. If you've forgotten your password, select "I forgot my password" and follow the instructions. Once at your family homepage, work through each member's page to complete/update personal information, authorizations and project information. PLEASE MAKE SURE CLUB AND PROJECT INFORMATION IS UP TO DATE! Pay special attention to your "Years in 4-H" and be sure to add each project a member is/has been involved in.

MSU Extension recognizes that the COVID-19 pandemic and other associated factors have put a financial strain on many families. Therefore, we have again opted to waive the Michigan 4-H participation fee of \$20 per person or \$60 per family for the 2021-2022 4-H program year which began September 1, 2021. Michigan 4-H Rabbit/Cavy Scholarships

Award amount: \$500 per scholarship, up to four scholarships are given annually
