

Nominees Sought for National Ag Day Student Leadership Program

Virtual AND In-Person January through March 2022

National 4-H Council is pleased to offer an agriculture leadership opportunity for 10 students to participate in the 2022 National Ag Day Student Leadership Program. The program prepares and engages young people to raise awareness of the importance of the agricultural industry and its impact on our nation's society and economy. The Agriculture Council of America (ACA) sponsors student representatives from across the country to participate in this program. The students—from FFA, AFA, 4-H and MANRRS—put a face on the future of agriculture and personally emphasize the importance of agriculture in our everyday lives with stakeholders.



The 2022 program will consist of a series of virtual sessions that will include special governmental guests, experts and advocates in the ag industry for all student representatives. Half of the of the 4-H students (5) will be selected to join other student organization leaders, in-person, in Washington, D.C. to conduct Congressional Visits on National Ag Day

Thanks to Bayer's Science Matters partnership with 4-H, travel expenses for the five selected to conduct Congressional Visits will be reimbursed. The onsite expenses of (Monday night) lodging, meals and ground transportation will be covered through the ACA sponsorship. There is no cost associated with the virtual training component.

- Each Land Grant University (LGU) may nominate up to two delegates to represent 4-H.
- All 4-H nominations must be approved by the LGU's 4-H Administrator, i.e. State Program Leader or a representative thereof.
- Applications, including a letter of reference from a 4-H professional, are due by Friday, January 7, 2022.
- Participants will be selected through a competitive application process.
- 4-H representatives should... ;Be between the ages of 18-23 and enrolled in post high school education ; Be 4-H alum or currently active in collegiate 4-H ; Have a strong interest and/or career plan in the agricultural industry ; Have the desire to learn about communication and leadership skills.

Students must be able to participate in all of the following sessions.

- Wednesday, January 26, 2022 Virtual Ag Day Kickoff, Student Training, evening, 90 minutes
- Thursday, February 17, 2022 Virtual Ag Day Part 2, Student Training, evening, 90 minutes
- Tuesday, March 8, 2022 Virtual Ag Day Part 3, Student Training, evening, 90 minutes
- Wednesday, March 16, 2022 Virtual Ag Day Part 4, Student Training, evening, 90 minutes
- Monday Tuesday, March 21-22, 2022 National Ag Day Congressional Visits on Capitol Hill.

In-person in Washington, DC. Participants to arrive in DC by Monday afternoon; program concludes after Tuesday lunch.

To be considered as a 4-H representative for the 2022 National Ag Day Student Leadership Program, nominees must submit their applications by Friday, January 7, 2022. Applications must include:

- Following this training, how do you plan to use what you learned to advocate for agriculture?

New indoor masking guidelines for MSU Extension events

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to shift and change, Michigan State University issued new guidance for the broader MSU community on October 13. These changes impact attendees of MSU Extension programs occurring on non-MSU property. Effective immediately, the following guidelines apply to *indoor* MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H programs or events:

- o Those who participate in MSU Extension programming indoors on MSU property or any property reserved/rented for an MSU event are required to wear a face covering. This applies to anyone over the age of 2, regardless of vaccination status (unless they have a medical exemption).
- o Those who participate in MSU Extension programming indoors on non-MSU property are encouraged but not required to wear masks unless required by local regulations or the venue. This may include off-site Michigan 4-H programs hosted by MSU Extension volunteer groups. MSU Extension personnel in attendance are required to wear a face covering.

For the purpose of MSU Extension events and programs, indoor events are considered those in an enclosed building with limited airflow. Barns and other outbuildings that have multiple doors that can be fully opened to maximize air flow are considered an outdoor, open air facility.

Who must wear a mask?

The following chart may be useful to clarify masking requirements for MSU Extension professionals and program participants. For the purpose of this chart, MSU Extension volunteers and 4-H members are considered participants.
