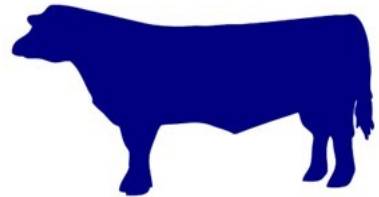


2021 Ingham County Fair Beef and Dairy Steer/Heifer Project Submission Card

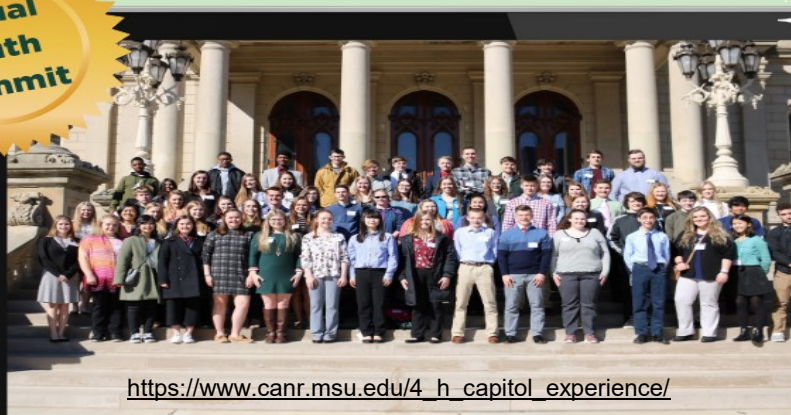

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY

The **4-H Science team SPIN Club Coordinator** will be responsible for making videos to support the *Teaching Science When You Don't Know Diddly-squat* lesson series and delivering programming to area schools and/or community partners.

- Make Videos
- Plan and organize 10 virtual 4-H SPIN (special interest) clubs with volunteers that focus on STEM
- Engage between 50 and 60 new youth in 4-H SPIN club programming
- Provide support to 4-H volunteers who provide guest programming or otherwise support 4-H SPIN Clubs and associated activities
- Collect data and submit reports to the Site Supervisor and to the 4-H STEAM Corps Program Manager
- Potential for activities related to COVID-19 response, specifics TBD

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- At least 18 years of age
- U.S. citizen, U.S. national or lawful permanent resident of the U.S.
- Possess a high school diploma or GED equivalent
- Pass the following checks: ICHAT, National Sex Offender Public Website, HireRight, FBI Fingerprinting, and any additional checks based upon State of Residence

PREFERRED SKILLS

- Experience working with diverse (multiple ages, ethnicities, religions, etc.) populations

WORK ENVIRONMENT

Due to the on-going COVID-19 pandemic and the need to maintain social distancing protocols, members will serve from home for a significant part of the year. Members will receive a computer from MSU Extension, and they need to have a secure and stable Internet connection. The program will provide extensive and ongoing training and support on coordinating online programming. It is important that members are comfortable with technology and/or willing to learn.

COMPENSATION

Members will receive a living allowance of \$7,140 (pre-tax) to be distributed bi-weekly throughout their service term as well as student loan forbearance for qualified loans. Upon successful completion of service, an education award in the amount of \$3,097.50 will be issued. Members will serve 30 hours/week.
