The Ingham County team members have been dedicated to weekly workouts, farm visits and clinics for the past six months and everyone did a first-class job representing our county! An overview of their accomplishments includes:

Jr. Novice division, The Junior Novice team dominated their division! The team placed 1st in reasons and was the 1st place Junior Novice team overall! Garrett Gould placed 7th in reasons. Laurie Baumer placed 5th in reasons and was 10th place overall in the division. Isabella Halstead placed 1st in reasons and was 2nd place overall in the division. Adelaide Halstead placed 3rd in reasons and was the 1st place Junior Novice overall winner.

Jr. Regular division, The Junior Regular team was dominant in their division as well. They were 1st place in reasons and the 1st place Junior Regular team overall! Each member earned a top ten finish in overall placings. Mary Baumer was 8th place overall in the division. Tabby Hayworth placed 2nd in reasons and was the division's 3rd place overall winner. Maddie Gerding placed 3rd in reasons and was the Junior Regular

Call for Help!



Ingham County 4-H and Angel House in Mason has partnered together to provide 4-H programming to the youth within the facilities. Angel House is a therapeutic mother/baby residential program for pregnant and parenting teen girls who are in foster care or are referred through the courts. Angel House uses a trauma informed approach to end cycles of abuse and neglect by providing mothers with the support they need to transition to independent living, nurture their children, and be successful members of the community.

This summer 4-H will be providing these teen mothers with an animal therapy SPIN club to help achieve goals Angel House has for them. The meetings will be held on Thursday nights from 6-7pm at the Fairgrounds starting June 27th and running until the end of August, no meeting July 4th or fair week. We are looking for 4-Hers to volunteer to bring their animals to the meetings and teach the girls about the basic care and needs each species has and allow the girls to work with the animals as well, grooming, walking, etc. These girls have never been exposed to this type of programming before, and probably have never been exposed to many of the animals as well.

This is a great opportunity for both you as a 4-Her to be able to teach the skills you have learned in your 4-H project as well as for the girls of Angel House. We need volunteers for beef, dairy, dairy feeder, horses, rabbits/cavies, poultry, goats, dogs, and cats. Each meeting will mostly be dedicated to a specific species; however, there is room for overlap. The 2019 three day Camp will have an all new format, consisting of an all new line up of Clinicians and participation events. Participants will be grouped together based on chosen discipline and age /skill level.

Riding improvement instruction is offered for various levels of skill; walk-trot, through advanced. Disciplines offered are English Hunt Seat, Western, Gymkhana, and Dressage. Participants will choose one discipline and instruction level for the entire camp. Within the camp groups, additional demonstrations and information on horse care, horse behavior, training techniques and various other horse related topics.

Members of a recognized Michigan 4-H program, 8-19 years of age by January 1, 2019 may register. Non 4-H members also 8–19 yrs. are welcome but must pay an additional \$20.00 participation fee. Participants provide their own horse, tack, stall bedding and supplies and are required to care for their own horse during the three day stay at camp. Their horse must remain on the fair grounds for the entire camp. Participants are allowed to camp as long as there is a parent/guardian/ or leader present between 7pm and 7am with the participants in the camping area.

All 4-H rules apply at camp along with additional rules and guidelines listed in the registration packet.

EXPLORATION DAYS

This fun MSU pre-college program could be the highlight of your summer - it could even change your life! About 2,500 youth (ages 11-19) and chaperones from across Michigan attend annually.

4-H Exploration Days registration goes from mid-March through April with session assignments made on a first-come, first-served basis. As you select your session choices, be sure to watch for age restrictions! **Age requirements for sessions are based on your age as of January 1.** Visit https://www.canr.msu.edu/4 h exploration days/

At 4-H Exploration Days, you'll:

- Learn new ideas and skills that will make you think about careers AND teach you something you can use back home
- Get involved and learn by doing, not just sitting and listening
- Try things that just aren't available in your county
- Get to be independent and responsible for yourself by managing your time, making good decisions and working as a team
- Meet people who are—and aren't—like you, from every part of the state, face-to-face instead of on Facebook
- Have the entire <u>Michigan State University</u> campus—and everything you can do there—right outside your window
- There'll be more than 200 session choices held on and off campus. You'll choose one or two for your three-day stay.
- You'll live in a Michigan State University dorm and eat in the cafeteria—just like MSU students do.
- Sessions are taught by people who know their stuff, including MSU faculty members, 4-H volunteers and staff members and other experts.
- It's not all sessions! There's plenty of time for fun, including swimming, skating, souvenir shopping, exploring, bowling, basketball—even a great dance Thursday night.

The 2019 cost is \$220.00. There is an additional \$20 4-H participation fee for youth not yet enrolled in 4-H. The fee includes meals, a shared room in a dorm, sessions and a t-shirt.
