Camping Rules and Regulations for 2021

APPLICATIONS FOR CAMPING SITES AT THE 2021 INGHAM COUNTY FAIR WILL BE CONSIDERED BY COMPLETING THE CAMPING FORM AND BRINGING/MAILING TO THE FAIR OFFICE WITH PAYMENT BY CASH OR CHECK.

- 1. All camping applications must be received at the Fair Office **by 5 p.m. on WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15, 2021.** First consideration will be given to Superintendents of Livestock/Light Horses and Youth Exhibitors.
- Generators can be used in designated areas from dawn to dusk only, upon permission from the Fair Office.
- 3. Pets are not permitted on the grounds.
- 4. There will be no vehicle parking overnight in the campgrounds. If there are vehicles parked inside the fenced areas, they will be towed at the owners' expense. No parking is allowed on any of the drives or between the camping area and exhibit barns at any time. ADA accessible parking will be available by contacting the camping superintendent.
- 5. Every campsite shall be required to have a responsible adult (18 years or older) staying each night.
- 6. Quiet Time: All occupants of campers are required to return to their campsite and begin a quiet time no later than 11:30 pm. The Camping Superintendent and Executive Director retain the sole right to remove any camping unit that is not in compliance with this rule. If a unit is removed for violation of this rule, no refund of fees will be made.
- 7. All hitches must be readily accessible for emergency purposes. You may not park your trailers front to back and you must park within the space provided to you. You may not park campers in a circular design. <u>This will be strictly enforced.</u>
- 8. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR ILLEGAL DRUGS ALLOWED AT THE CAMPSITES OR WITHIN CAMPERS OR TENTS.
- 9. No bicycles, ATVs, scooters, skateboards, roller blades, or other wheeled rides allowed. Golf carts permitted only upon presentation of proper insurance (listing name of insured driver) and medical documentation to the Fair Office for issuance of a permit. Any golf carts on the grounds without the proper permit from the Fair Office will be removed.
- 10. Campfires are NOT allowed. If caught having a campfire, you will be asked to leave immediately.
- 11. All extension cords must be 12-gauge, or the same gauge as provided with recreational vehicle.
- 12. Water hoses must be RV/Marine-rated.
- 13. No digging on the fairgrounds. No stakes in the ground three (3) feet either side of power or water lines.
- 14. Only one electrical cord per camping unit plugged into your assigned pedestal. You may NOT plug one into the 110V and one into the 30/50 AMP service.
- 15. Anyone found tampering with a LOCKED pedestal to gain access to an additional electricity source will result in automatic loss of camping privileges for 2022.
- 16. No discharge of water or waste on the grounds will be permitted by order of the Health Department. There is a dump station on the fairgrounds (located on the South End). Convenience pumping is available during fair week by signing up in the Fair Office.
- 17. Fire lanes around the campsites must ALWAYS be clear.
- 18. All campers MUST check in with the Camping Superintendent upon arrival. North Camping must enter through the North service gate and South Camping must enter the South service gate. Campers can enter Thursday, July 29, 2021, from 6 pm to 8 pm or Friday, July 30, 2021, between 7 am and 9 am ONLY. All other times, or late arrivals, must be pre-approved by the Camping Superintendent. Line up in the grass parking lot, not on the pavement. Do not park on M-36 or city roads.
- 19. Any camper or member of the camping unit, who violates any rule or regulation in 2021, may also lose camping privileges for 2022 and/or their camping unit towed. Ingham County Fair will not be held responsible for any damage sustained while being towed.
- 20. Rules and regulations may be changed/amended upon receipt of additional Executive Orders of the Governor, or at the discretion of the Ingham County Health Department or Ingham County Fair Board and will be posted in the Fair Office and distributed, as applicable.
- 21. Campers at the North End may be removed on Sunday, August 8 beginning at 8 am. Permission to remove early must be obtained from the Camping Superintendent. Removal without permission will result not being permitted to camp the following year.

YQCA Certification Needed to Sell Livestock At Fair

All youth must be YQCA certified in order to **sell your swine**, **beef or dairy market steer/feeder projects at Fair**.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21. YQCA is designed as an annual education and certification program focused on food safety, animal well-being and character awareness for youth producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, market rabbit, and poultry.

Complete your certification at <u>http://yqca.org/</u>. You will need to be prepared to pay for the cost of the YQCA training when you register with a credit/debit card. Register using your 4honline account.

YQCA is now offering a test-out option for youth who are looking to obtain a YQCA certification. This option works the same as the PQA test-out option.

MSU Extension resumes limited 4-H face-to-face programming

Over the past several months, MSU Extension has been working diligently to chart a path toward resuming in-person programming during the current public health crisis. Thanks to the thoughtfully crafted guidelines created by MSU Extension professionals, we are excited to share that MSU Extension will resume hosting face-to-face programs and events that adhere to public health guidelines.

As of May 17, Michigan 4-H professionals and volunteers may submit a request to host an in-person event that follows specific guidelines and requirements. CLUB CORNER

The Michigan 4-H State Administrators meet with members of our 4-H F2F taskforce each Monday to review any changes from CDC, MDHHS or MSU from the following week. As previously indicated by Governor Whitmer MDHHS activated some changes <u>effective June</u> <u>1</u>. Those relevant to us involve the maximum sizes of groups allowed to meet indoors and outdoors. The MSU community compact does not provide any guidance on group size, thus to keep with our efforts to stay in alignment with CDC, MDHHS, and MSU the following changes have been made to our in-person guidance:

Indoors, residential:

Current guidance: up to 15 people from 3 different households.

New guidance: no limit

Indoors, nonresidential:

• Current guidance: up to 25 people

New guidance: 25 people or 50% of capacity or 30 people per 1,000 square feet (whichever is greater).

Outdoors (residential and non-residential):

• Current guidance: residential is 50 persons OR 20 persons per 1,000 square feet up to 300, whichever is greater. Non-residential is up to 300 people.

New guidance: No limit.

These changes impact in-person events lead by MSUE staff and volunteers. Guidance that notes group size restrictions has been updated on our website and within the Qualtrics survey. Please see the <u>summary guide</u> for an updated, comprehensive look at our definitions and specifications for in-person programming.
