

People are not allowed in the barn after this time


The lights will be out

Exhibitors are to completely clean and change bedding daily.

There will be a purebred class assuming there are at least 10 animals for the class.

- Swine released on Friday morning will be those being shipped to the main destinations (most likely: Producers, Manchester, Jerome's and Napoleon). All others will be released at midnight on Saturday.
- Loading out will be the same procedure as last year, the barn will be closed with select adults and senior youth coordinating the loading of swine.
- Swine pen tear down will be on Sunday, August 4 at 8:00 am All swine exhibitors are expected to help
