# Farewell Letter—Ashleigh Apel, 4-H SPIN Club Coordinator

It is hard to believe that my time here in Ingham County as the 4-H SPIN Club Coordinator is coming to an end. On August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019 I will be ending my AmeriCorps service on the 4-H STEAM Corps. It has been a very rewarding experience for me to be a part of Ingham County 4-H and incorporate so many new and fulfilling programs for the youth here. There were times when things were stressful and some things that were not all that successful but in the end everything worked out and at the end of the day, as long as the youth were having fun and learning something that is what matters the most to me.

As an AmeriCorps 4-H STEAM Corps Leader I had many goals I was working towards achieving in my year of service. My target group was underserved urban youth. The goal was to expand 4-H to urban areas of the county such as Lansing and East Lansing. By partnering with local schools and organizations within the community I was able to reach 160 new youth with my programs, not including the 50+ current 4-H youth that also participated in my programs. I was able to implement 27 short-term special interest clubs (SPIN clubs) that covered a wide variety of topics such as cooking, gardening, robotics, basketball, environmental science, animal therapy, karate and more! In addition to that I was able to successfully recruit 19 new adult volunteers. I could not be more proud of the way this year of service has gone for me, and I am so glad I was able to make such a large impact on the youth here in this community.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the adult volunteers and community partners that were able to help me make this program such a success! In addition, I would like to thank all the youth that came and participated in my programs, I hope you enjoyed them just as much as I did. I also would like to thank all the support I have gotten in the community from 4-H Council and the staff here in MSU Extension, because of you my time here in Ingham County has been overwhelmingly welcoming. Then one last big, huge thank you to my site Supervisor Glenda Weiss. I would not be where I am today without your support. You are not only a supervisor to me but additionally you are a mentor and a friend. Not only have you taken me under your wing in this last year, but you have supported me since I was confused teenager in 4-H not knowing what I was going to do for the rest of my life. Thank you for the continuous support you showed me during my time in 4-H, helping me apply for the State Awards, writing my letters of recommendations for college applications and more. Most of all thank you for guiding me and helping me find my true passion and showing what it feels like to give back to the youth within the community.

With that I leave you. I am passing on the baton to the next AmeriCorps member who I know will continue to grow the 4-H program here in Ingham County.

Attention 4-H members and volunteers—Ingham County 4-H Council is seeking nominations for members to serve on the 2019-2020 4-H Council. You would be a great candidate for this position if you:

- Want to help provide quality youth development programs for the children of Ingham County
- Are interested in promoting 4-H in Ingham County
- Would like to provide support to 4-H members and leaders to build life skills
- Have ideas for new and exciting 4-H projects, programs, or activities
- Wish to become more involved in 4-H

The Ingham County 4-H Council is composed of up to four adults and four teens from each of the five 4-H districts. 4-H leaders, teens and other adults vitally interested in the 4-H program are eligible for membership on the 4-H Council. The Ingham County 4-H Council serves to promote, implement and guide the 4-H Youth Program in Ingham County by working with the County MSUE staff. In addition, the Council assists in establishing policy and procedures for the 4-H Youth Programs in Ingham County.

Youth members on 4-H Council must be between 13 and 19 years old. Youth members are reappointed yearly and serve a one year term. Adult council members are reappointed yearly, and can serve up to eight consecutive terms. 4-H Council meets the third Wednesday of each month. Youth and adults interested in applying for a position on 4-H Council should contact the 4-H Office at 676-7207.

# **Ambassadors**

In addition to teens elected through their 4-H districts, 4-H Council also appoints up to ten 4-H Ambassadors each year. Ambassadors are honorary members of 4-H Council with full voting rights. Ambassadors are 4-H members ages 13-19 who have a desire to promote the 4-H program and develop leadership skills. Appointment as an ambassador is a one year commitment. Ambassadors meet throughout the year as well as attend the regularly scheduled 4-H Council meetings.

# Youth Representatives

Ingham County 4-H and FFA Livestock Committee is seeking 4-H and FFA teens, ages 13 and up, to serve as youth representatives on their committee. Each livestock superintendent will select a youth representative for their species to serve on the Livestock Committee. The eight species represented on the committee are: beef, dairy market/feeder, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, poultry, and rabbits.

Youth representative positions are a one year appointment; a youth may not serve as the representative in a single species for more than two consecutive years. The responsibilities include:

- Attend Livestock Committee meetings—regular meetings are scheduled the 1st Wednesday of September, November, January, March, May, and July.
- Provide input from the species you represent and youth perspective to the committee.
- Help guide the direction of 4-H livestock programs in Ingham County.
- Assist in decision making related to livestock projects including, but not limited to, education, administration, and the Junior Livestock Auctions.

# At-large Members

The committee is also seeking adults to serve as At-large members. At-large members may be 4-H volunteers, parents, or community members (please note, any person elected to an at-large position must complete the MSU Extension Volunteer Selection Process if they have not already done so). At-large members serve two-year terms on the committee, and may serve not more than two consecutive terms. At-large members will be selected by the Livestock Committee from those who submit applications.
