# 2019-2020 Re-Enrollment is Now Open!

Log in to your <u>4HOnline</u> Family account to submit enrollment for each member of your family - participating Youth and Adults (\*Adults only if a volunteer).

Go to http://mi.4honline.com and select "I have a profile" and enter the email and password you created last year. If you've forgotten your password, select "I forgot my password" and follow the instructions. Once at your family homepage, work through each member's page to complete/update personal information, authorizations and project information. PLEASE MAKE SURE CLUB AND PROJECT INFORMATION IS UP TO DATE! Pay special attention to your "Years in 4-H" and be sure to add each project a member is/has been involved in.

There is no option to pay online. The participation annual fee for \$20 per individual/ \$60 per family will still be collected by club leaders. Reenrollment deadline is December 31, 2019. If needed, scholarships are available. Please contact the 4-H Office for details.



**Community Leaders:** You must reenroll in order to have access to your club's information. Once approved by County staff, your access will be restored.

Please remember that reenrolled members will remain as pending until payment is received in the 4-H Office.
