Log in to your [4HOnline](#) Family account to submit enrollment for each member of your family - participating Youth and Adults (*Adults only if a volunteer). All adult volunteers must be reenrolled by November 1.

Go to <http://mi.4honline.com> and select "I have a profile" and enter the email and password you created last year. If you've forgotten your password, select "I forgot my password" and follow the instructions. Once at your family homepage, work through each member's page to complete/update personal information, authorizations and project information. **PLEASE MAKE SURE CLUB AND PROJECT INFORMATION IS UP TO DATE!** Pay special attention to your "Years in 4-H" and be sure to add **each project** a member is/has been involved in.

There is no option to pay online. The participation annual fee for **\$20 per individual/ \$60 per family** will still be collected by club leaders. **Reenrollment deadline is December 31, 2019.** If needed, scholarships are available. Please contact the 4-H Office for details.

General Jackpot Rules

- Open to all youth to 21 years old as of 01/11/2020, as long as they can maintain animal control.
- Entry Fee: \$35/head postmarked by December 15, 2019 \$50/head day of show. MSYC sanctioned Shows. Entry fee required for each day exhibitors shows.
- Jackpot showmanship classes offered for pee wee, 8-11, 12-14, 15-17 and 18-21 years of age. Awards for showmanship will be given. \$10 entry fee.
- Pens will be provided for all animals at a fee of \$5.00 per pen (holds one animal). Exhibitors are responsible for providing wood shavings. (Shavings on site for purchase) 1 animal per pen. Tack stalls available for the same \$5 fee. No showing off trailers per fair rules. One fee for the entire weekend.
- Class Prizes to top 3 in class.
- The total number of animals entered will determine the number of classes and class sizes. Animals will show in the class they are assigned.
- Classes will be determined by individual animal weight and the total number of animals. No minimum weight, MAX 300 lbs.
- Only barrows and gilts will be allowed in hog classes. Purebreds will show by breed with a minimum of 5 needed for a breed. (Purebred Papers required) if there are not enough for a breed, purebreds will show in an AOB class. Breeding class gilt (No weight limit) entries will have to pay dual entry fee if showing in market class. Champion Breeding gilt will not participate in overall. Overall Champion Breeding gilt payout of \$100.
- The top three hogs will be re-weighed in class. Hogs weighing more or less than 10 lbs above or below the declared weight will be disqualified from the show and all other hogs will move up one placing in class.
- Hogs must have a premise ID (840) tag. All out of state livestock must have health papers available at check in.
- All decisions made by Michigan Kickoff Jackpot Committee are final.

Get ready for the 2020 4-H State Award applications process!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences

that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards (13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member. Final candidates for the junior, senior and group level awards in each project area will be selected to participate in the State Awards program during 4-H Exploration Days in June where final selection and announcement of winners will take place.

What can you do because of 4-H? Share for a chance to win!

Michigan 4-H'ers ages 11-12 are encouraged to share how 4-H has impacted them through the 4-H Mark of Excellence Essay Contest. A great introduction to the Michigan 4-H State Awards program, Mark of Excellence contestants write a 500 word essay on the topic of "Because of 4-H, I can..." Winners will receive a certificate of recognition and medal to commemorate their accomplishment.

Essays are due to respective county 4-H offices by February 1. County 4-H programs then select up to two youth essays as their representatives and submit those names and essays to the State 4-H Awards Committee. The committee uses the essays to inform the public about what 4-H means to youth and copies are also shared with the Michigan State 4-H Office, Michigan 4-H Foundation, and Kettunen Center.
