
4-H swine project must be in exhibitor's possession by May 1st. Identification cards for swine must be submitted by May 15th to the 4-H Office along with Swine Health Affidavit. Complete this card and submit with hair root/follicle sample (10 to 15) in a Ziploc bag (1 bag per pig). Please put Exhibitor Name, 4-H Club, Ear Notch, Gender, and Breed on Ziploc Bag. All pigs will be tagged during weigh-in at fair. See fair book for 2019 identification, tagging, weigh-in, and show procedures.





If you need instructions for collecting a hair follicle sample from your pig please see this web link: <u>http://www.asi.k-state.edu/doc/ youth/swinehairinstructions.pdf</u>. For Ingham County Fair, you will need 10-15 hairs with root/follicles from each pig listed. You will put the samples in a Ziploc bag, not an envelope.



Ingham County 4-H & Fair reserve the right to test any of the hair follicles submitted to match to pigs actually shown at the fair. Exhibitors should keep in mind that the intent of the 4-H project is a learning experience; the member should be keeping records on the specific pigs identified throughout the learning process. The purpose of possession dates and identifying animals is to pinpoint which animals are the exhibitors 4-H project for the current year. Fair registration tips:

- If you have 2 individual pigs you register for market class twice (class 10101)
- All exhibitors are highly encouraged to register for showmanship for their age category.
- Only those qualified should register for home grown class; these pigs must be shown in class 10101 also.
- Exhibitors encouraged to register for record keeping and Tom Stid Award. Please note that these projects can be exhibited in swine department as well as record keeping department during Still Exhibit judging.
- Members must have a current LQCA or PQA number to show/sell at fair.
- A \$5 fee will be charged when turning in hair follicles for each exhibitor for hair follicle testing.
- Exhibitor will receive their swine NEUS tags when they arrive at Fair. If needed for other shows, NEUS tags are available in the 4-H Office.

Record Keeping Books

The 2019 three day Camp will have an all new format, consisting of an all new line up of Clinicians and participation events. Participants will be grouped together based on chosen discipline and age /skill level.

Riding improvement instruction is offered for various levels of skill; walk-trot, through advanced. Disciplines offered are English Hunt Seat, Western, Gymkhana, and Dressage. Participants will choose one discipline and instruction level for the entire camp. Within the camp groups, additional demonstrations and information on horse care, horse behavior, training techniques and various other horse related topics.

Members of a recognized Michigan 4-H program, 8-19 years of age by January 1, 2019 may register. Non 4-H members also 8–19 yrs. are welcome but must pay an additional \$20.00 participation fee. Participants provide their own horse, tack, stall bedding and supplies and are required to care for their own horse during the three day stay at camp. Their horse must remain on the fair grounds for the entire camp. Participants are allowed to camp as long as there is a parent/guardian/ or leader present between 7pm and 7am with the participants in the camping area.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

#DaretoServeChallenge Keeping with the theme, as many of you may know April is National Service Month and 4-H members all over are pledging their hands to larger service and participating in the #DaretoServeChallenge. During Exploration Days this year 4-H STEAM Corps AmeriCorps Members from all over the state are coming together to host a service scavenger hunt for members of exploration days to participate in. During this event we will be collecting supplies to make personal hygiene kits to donate to homeless shelters in Lansing. But how are we going to collect enough supplies? That's where 4-H members come in. The 4-H STEAM Corps member for Ingham, Ashleigh Apel will be collecting donated supplies for this event for Ingham County. This is a simple way, you as a 4-H member can participate in the #DaretoServeChallenge. All you have to do is bring in one, or more hygiene kits and drop it off at the MSU Extension office. Each kit consists of; a toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, hand sanitizer, mouthwash, one non-perishable food item, and a refillable water bottle. We will be collecting supplies until Monday, June 17th.

Angel House Ingham County 4-H and Angel House in Mason has partnered together to provide 4-H programming to the youth within the facilities. Angel House is a therapeutic mother/ baby residential program for pregnant and parenting teen girls who are in foster care or are referred through the courts. Angel House uses a trauma informed approach to end cycles of abuse and neglect by providing mothers with the support they need to transition to independent living, nurture their children, and be successful members of the community.

This summer 4-H will be providing these teen mothers with an animal therapy SPIN club to help achieve goals Angel House has for them. The meetings will be held on Thursday nights from 6-7pm at the Fairgrounds starting June 27th and running until the end of August, no meeting July 4th or fair week. We are looking for 4-Hers to volunteer to bring their animals to the meetings and teach the girls about the basic care and needs each species has and allow the girls to work with the animals as well, grooming, walking, etc. These girls have never been exposed to this type of programming before, and probably have never been exposed to many of the animals as well.

This is a great opportunity for both you as a 4-Her to be able to teach the skills you have learned in your 4-H project as well as for the girls of Angel House. I still need volunteers for the following dates; July 25th, Aug 8th, Aug 15th, and Aug 22nd. The species we already have volunteers for is horse and pony, dogs, and cats. We still need volunteers for any of the following species, rabbits/cavies, poultry, sheep, goats, and cattle (beef or dairy)... - All members must submit their fair entries online along with payment. To submit online entries, go to http://ingham.fairwire.com/
- 4-H classes begin on page 47 of the Fair Book (no green heading this year).
- Don't forget to enter classes and submit applications for special award categories—Livestock Committee Scholarships, Fair Board Special Awards, Barbara Godby Award, Tom Stid Award, Horse Senior Award.
- Entries are not limited by class except livestock, entrepreneurship, and shooting sports. Exhibitors may enter and be judged for more than one item in classes. The member must select the class information online separately for each entry in the class. (i.e. if a member completes 3 quilts during the year, they may enter the quilt class 3 times).
- Record Keeping projects —superintendent will allow members to exhibit same item as another project area. (i.e. if a member submits a record book for a livestock project in the animal species division, they may submit a duplicate copy in Record Keeping)
- Save a copy of your online entry for verification if there are any questions about which classes you entered.
