Bird biosecurity reminders



With cases of highly pathogenic avian influenza on the rise, owners of poultry projects and other birds are encouraged to implement preventative measures.

This includes keeping animals contained at their own facilities, as well as:

Preventing contact between domestic and wild birds by bringing them indoors or ensuring their area is enclosed.

Washing hands before and after handling birds and when moving between different coops.

Disinfecting boots and other gear when moving between coops.

Not sharing equipment or other supplies between coops or other farms.

Cleaning and disinfecting equipment and other supplies between uses.

Using well or municipal water as drinking water for birds.

Ensuring there is no contact between poultry feed/feed ingredients and wild birds or rodents.

Wearing clean clothing and footwear that has not been worn in a home coop into public venues.

- 8. All riders 19 and under must wear an ASTM/SEI helmet when riding in Gymkhana and English classes.
- 9. Pee Wee or Lead line classes are available for youth 7 and under. Lead line participants can enter Pee Wee Showmanship but may not participate in the Pee Wee Walk or Walk Trot classes.
- 10. The show committee reserves the right to combine or spilt any classes.
- 11. The show committee reserves the right to require exhibitors or horse's proof of age if there is a dispute.
- 12. As per Michigan law all horses must have a current year's copy of a negative Coggins test.

APPLICATIONS FOR CAMPING SITES AT THE 2022 INGHAM COUNTY FAIR WILL BE CONSIDERED BY COMPLETING THE CAMPING FORM AND BRINGING/MAILING TO THE FAIR OFFICE WITH PAYMENT BY CASH OR CHECK.

- 1. All camping applications must be received at the Fair Office by 5 p.m. on June 15, 2022. First consideration will be given to Superintendents of Livestock/Light Horses and Youth Exhibitors.
- 2. ALL CAMPERS MUST PROVIDE A PASS IN ORDER TO GAIN ADMITTANCE TO THE FAIRGROUNDS. CAMPING FEE DOES NOT INCLUDE A PASS INTO THE FAIR. PASSES ARE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AT THE FAIR OFFICE.
- 3. Generators can be used in designated areas from dawn to dusk only, upon permission from the Fair Office.
- 4. Pets are not permitted on the grounds.
- 5. There will be no vehicle parking overnight in the campgrounds. If there are vehicles parked inside the fenced areas, they will be towed at the owners' expense. No parking is allowed on any of the drives or between the camping area and exhibit barns at any time. ADA accessible parking will be available by contacting the camping superintendent.
- 6. Every campsite shall be required to have a responsible adult (18 years or older) staying each night.
- 7. Quiet Time: All occupants of campers are required to return to their campsite and begin a quiet time no later than 11:30 pm. The Camping Superintendent and Executive Director retain the sole right to remove any camping unit that is not in compliance with this rule. If a unit is removed for violation of this rule, no refund of fees will be made.
- 8. All hitches must be readily accessible for emergency purposes. You may not park your trailers front to back and you must park within the space provided to you. You may not park campers in a circular design. This will be strictly enforced.
- 9. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR ILLEGAL DRUGS ALLOWED AT THE CAMPSITES OR WITHIN CAMPERS OR TENTS.
- 10. No bicycles, ATVs, scooters, skateboards, roller blades, or other wheeled rides allowed. Golf carts permitted only upon presentation of proper insurance (listing name of insured driver) and medical documentation to the Fair Office for issuance of a permit. Any golf carts on the grounds without the proper permit from the Fair Office will be removed.
- 11. Campfires are NOT allowed. If caught having a campfire, you will be asked to leave immediately.
- 12. All extension cords must be 12-gauge, or the same gauge as provided with recreational vehicle.
- 13. Water hoses must be RV/Marine-rated.
- 14. Each unit must have a fire extinguisher in working order.
- 15. No digging on the fairgrounds. No stakes in the ground three (3) feet either side of power or water lines.
- 16. Only one electrical cord per camping unit plugged into your assigned pedestal. You may NOT plug one into the 110V and one into the 30/50 AMP service.
- 17. Anyone found tampering with a LOCKED pedestal to gain access to an additional electricity source will result in automatic loss of camping privileges for 2023.
- 18. No discharge of water or waste on the grounds will be permitted by order of the Health Department. There is a dump station on the fairgrounds (located on the South End). Convenience pumping is available during fair week by signing up in the FairOffice.
- 19. Fire lanes around the campsites must **ALWAYS** be clear.
- 20. All campers **MUST** check in with the Camping Superintendent upon arrival. North Camping must enter through the North service gate and South Camping must enter the South service gate. **Campers can enter Thursday**, **July 28**, **2022**, **from 6 pm to 8 pm or Friday**, **July 29**, **between 7 am and 9 am ONLY**. **All other times**, **or late arrivals**, **must be pre-approved by the Camping Superintendent**. Line up in the grass parking lot, not on the pavement. Do not park on M-36 or city roads.
- 21. Any camper or member of the camping unit, who violates any rule or regulation in 2022, may also lose camping privileges for 2023 and/or their camping unit towed. Ingham County Fair will not be held responsible for any damage sustained while being towed.
- 22. Rules and regulations may be changed/amended upon receipt of additional Executive Orders of the Governor, or at the discretion of the Ingham County Health Department or Ingham County Fair Board and will be posted in the Fair Office and distributed, as applicable.
- 23. Campers at the North End may be removed on Sunday, August 7, 2022, beginning at 8 am. Permission to remove early must be obtained from the Camping Superintendent. Removal without permission will result not being permitted to camp the following year.

2022 Ingham County 4-H State Horse Show Delegate Process

REQUIRED CRITERIA

- * Be a registered Ing Co 4-H member
- * Complete May 1 Exhibitor Horse/Pony form
- * Complete a State Show Application
- * Volunteer ≥4 hours

- * Take the written test: 0-10 points
- * Show your horse at qualifying shows and classes: earn points from your top 8 classes

Open Shows with classes eligible for State Show qualifying points

- * 4-H Leaders Show Fri-Sat, June 10-11 (Gymkhana Friday, full show bill Sat.)
- * CHUM Dressage Show Sat-Sun, June 25 & 26 (pre-registration required by May 31)
- * CHUM Open Show Fri-Sun, July 8-10 (Gymkhana Friday, full show bill Sat. and Sun.)

RULES

- 1. Rider 13-19 years old must be a registered Ingham County 4-H member and completed an Exhibitor's Horse /Pony Registration Form by June 11 including Coggins and pictures. Walk Trot exhibitors are not eligible.
- 2. State Show Application:
 - a. Complete form by June 11 and submit with Exhibitor/Horse Registration form. Only one horse per rider.
- 3. Volunteer Hours:
 - a. 4 hours minimum of community service between September 2021 and June 11, 2022.
 - b. Submit completed State Show Volunteer Hour Log by June 11 to 4-H office or Leaders Show office.
- 4. Written Test of Horse Science, Horsemanship and Rules knowledge
 - a. Test to be given at Leaders Show during lunch break on June 11 (approx. 1pm).
 - b. There will be one make up test event offered for extenuating circumstances. You must request a make up test with the State Show Delegate Committee no later than June 11.
 - c. See Ingham County 4-H Horse Handbook for point scale.
- 5. Horse changes may be requested up to June 1 in the event of a horse injury or death. A new State Show application, Exhibitor Horse Registration form, coggins, pictures, veterinary statement and letter requesting a change must be submitted to the State Show Delegate Committee for approval. Section changes may also be requested up to June 1 with the State Show Delegate Committee.
- 6. Classes: Top 8 classes to be calculated per rider on State Show identified horse and section.
 - a. Class points: ≥6 riders per class: 1st place receives 6 points with 6th place receiving 1 point. When less than 6 riders the point max will be set at the number or riders present (e.g., if a class has 3 riders, 1st place will receive 3 points with 3rd receiving 1 point).
 - b. Eligible classes for Gymkhana: Barrels, Flags, Down & Back, Speed & Action, Poles, and Keyhole.
 - c. Eligible classes for Performance: Showmanship, English Pleasure, English Equitation, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Reining, Trail*, Dressage Seat Equitation, 2 Dressage tests* (*in-hand trail, Intro Level dressage tests and musical freestyle not eligible)
 - i. Top 2 dressage tests will be used for points in Performance section and Dressage placings will be calculated amongst only 4-H riders.
 - ii. Showmanship, riding classes and gymkhana classes are placed amongst all riders within that specific age
- 7. State Show Delegate Committee will verify all criteria have been met and calculate points from the written test and top 8 classes and announce the State Show Delegates on July 10 at the conclusion of the CHUM horse show.
 - a. Per MI 4-H Extension the Ingham County quota for delegates for 2022 is 18 riders.
 - i. The top 18 riders qualify and 4 alternates with the next highest point totals will be identified in the event that one or more of the delegates is unable to compete at the 4-H State Horse Show.
 - ii. State show delegates must submit appropriate paperwork by July 13 by 5pm.

- Exhibitor must designate on the Exhibitor Registration form and complete a State Show Application by May 1.
- Must complete a minimum of 4 volunteer hours in the current program year and submit documentation.
- An exhibitor must take the State Show Written
 Test. The Test will be offered to all 4-H members
 at Leaders Show. An alternative date will be
 offered for exceptions only.
- 4. Exhibitors may compete at Leaders Show and CHUM Open shows. The exhibitor may enter as many classes as they chose; however only their top eight (8) placing/point will be used to calculate State Show points from designated classes.
- The exhibitors with the most points will be chosen as State Show delegate to fulfil our county quota of delegates. There is no minimum point requirement.
