Exploration Days registration opens April 14, 2022. Participation is limited to the first 1,000 youth across the state – it recommended that youth interested in attending should register soon. In 4-H Online there is a tip sheet with instructions on how to register.

7. 4-H Council

8. Leaders Show

Plans are being made for the Leader's Show. The show bill is available, ribbons are being ordered, and a judge has been hired. Back numbers will be ordered by Steve Sommers for approximately \$100. Job assignments will be shared with 4-H leaders at the May horse committee meeting. The walkie/talkies will eventually need to be replaced - Steven Sommers is exploring options.

Jenny Baker made a motion to order radios up to \$350. Motion carried. The radios will be stored in the 4-H office.

9. Horse Camp

The plans for the 2022 horse camp are underway. A committee of nine volunteers and parents are planning the camp for July 11-13, 2022 with two days of clinics and a horse show for horse camp participants. Campers will be required to bring their own lunch. Registration information will be available by the May 2022 Horse Committee Meeting.

10. Judging Team Report

The Ingham County Horse Judging team competed at the State 4-H Horse Judging Contest in March. The Ingham County Senior Regular Team won their division for both Reasons and Overall Team. The Senior team will be competing at the Eastern National 4-H Horse Judging Contest in November.

The Junior Regular contestant from Ingham County was first place in Reasons and Second Overall. The Junior Novice contestant, was 8th place in Reasons.

Members of the judging team spoke at the April County Commissioner meeting.

The team will be fundraising in order to travel to the national contest and is trying to raise \$4,400 for transportation, lodging, gas, food and the contest registration fee. They are asking local shows to include a fun class where the funds raised would go to the judging team. It was also suggested that the team submit a request to the Ingham County Fair Foundation for financial support.

11. Michigan Horse Council

The Michigan Horse Expo was successful based on attendance and vendor feedback. New board members were elected at the April meeting. They will be offering Horse Expo as a volunteer committee in the future. Suggestions for next year: allow a lower rate just for shopping or family discounts. The Michigan Horse Expo is one of the most expensive Expos to attend in the Midwest.

12. Banquet

The Saddlemates club is scheduled to host the banquet however, without fair awards we would only have a couple of awards to give out and they could be awarded at the 4-H Council banquet. The horse judging team can be recognized at the 4-H Council Banquet as well.

13. Old Business

State Show Qualification Process: If youth want to be considered as a delegate at the State 4-H Horse Show, the form must be completed by May 1st and submitted with fair horse forms. More delegates can be requested if needed.
