Beekeeping - Dept 12 Fair Banner - Dept 14

NEW THIS YEAR- Class #1406, Fair Banner (replaces fair book cover) Deadline July 1 - due to MSU Extension office. A color drawing measuring 8 1/2" x 11" with 1/2" of space on each edge, must depict some phase of Isabella County agriculture and/or fair scene. Cover must include fair name, city, 4-H and FFA emblems or names and the year 2024. This award may be won only once. Photos will be judged at the July Fair Board meeting. Banner will be hung in the Food Stand (or Still Exhibit Barn)

Small Animal News

Goats that will be entered in the small animal auction at the fair MUST have a scrapie tag BEFORE weigh-in. It is a <u>State mandate</u>, and if your auction goat does not have a scrapie tag, you will not be allowed to sell. ALL goats must have some identification; either the scrapie tag or a tattoo for those not in the auction. Goat weigh-in (for wethers only) is May 5 from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. in the small animal barn at the fairgrounds.

- If you do not already have your small animal purchase arranged, you should do so now. For
 example, there are only a couple of rabbit shows before the May 1 deadline and if you haven't
 placed an order or made contact with someone, it may be too late to get the breed you would
 like to have. If you wait until April 15 or later, it will be very difficult to have your animal(s) by
 May.
- Reminder, if you live outside of Isabella County and plan to sell in the small animal auction, you
 will need approval from the Small Animal Association. Please contact the Extension office for
 more details on getting approval. If you have already met with the Small Animal Association to
 sell in the auction and were approved, you do not have to do it again.
