

## **Small Animal News**

If members/leaders have any questions, please reach out to the species-specific superintendent. Educational information and other details/ reminders will be available to clinic attendees. We <a href="https://highly.com/highly/encourage">highly/encourage</a> members to attend at least one of the clinics so there are no surprises at fair check-in. Because clinics will be cancelled if temperatures reach 85 degrees or higher, it is a good idea to plan to attend the earliest available date. That also gives time for solving any issues that may be noted when animals are seen at the clinics.



- For fair class verification purposes, rabbit members (or a representative who has specific entry information) must attend either the June 21 or July 10 clinic. If either of those dates are cancelled, another option will be communicated closer to date.
- Poultry ban with the ban still in place, please do **NOT** bring any poultry to the clinic on 6/9. We will have a stuffed bird available to practice with.
- Goat area/pen set up will be Thursday, July 21 at 6 p.m.

#### For 4-H Parents, Grandparents, Guardians and Relatives

4-H is making the utmost attempt at making sure our youth are always safe. Therefore, MSU Extension has implemented a <u>Gold</u> and <u>Silver</u> volunteer screening process for different levels of volunteer status.

<u>ALL</u> parents, grandparents, guardians, other relatives and friends of 4-H <u>MUST</u> be screened at the Silver Status level to work in the 4-H food stand, monitor the Still Exhibit Building and work at a registration table. Please take the time to do the <u>Silver</u> Volunteer Status screening. It is free, easy to do and takes very little time. All that is required is to fill out a short volunteer application for a Silver level volunteer, and provide consent for a background check. No references or interviews will be needed (unless you wish to move to a Gold volunteer status at some point in the future).

### Fundraising News & Updates for Clubs

When a 4-H club is hosting an Open class horse show or any other kind of Open class show, there needs to be additional insurance coverage for all the non-4-H youth/adults that are participants in the show or have a specific role in working the show. (This additional insurance would not apply to anyone watching the show who for example, had an accident and fell in the bleachers). The insurance you need for this event is called a Special Activity policy and is obtained through American Income Life. In addition to covering any non-4-H affiliated youth and adults, it will provide double coverage to our 4-H youth and volunteers. This is a necessary requirement for a 4-H club hosting any type of Open class show. Please make sure that you fill out a <u>fundraising application PRIOR</u> to your fundraiser for office approval, and that you fill out the <u>fundraising report form</u> within 10 days after the fundraiser has ended.

I, Kristi Schreiber, nor any employee from MSUE can contact American Income Life for the additional insurance for an Open Show but I can provide you with the contact information.

#### **4-H Shooting Sports Age Policies:**

- 4-H Shooting Sports Programs are open to young people aged 8 through 19. The "4-H age" will be determined by a young person's age as of January 1 of the 4-H program year.
- 4-H members age 8 may participate in BB gun and basic archery training. Participation is at the discretion of the Certified Instructor and the participant must be under direct adult supervision (one on one).
- Cloverbuds (4-H ages 5 7) must wait until they reach the 4-H age of 8 to participate in shooting sports.
- Members ages 9 11 are limited to shooting Air Pellet, BB & archery at competitive events
- Youth must attend one qualifying shoot in order to compete at the county shoot

## **4-H Award Information**

#### **Outstanding 4-H Member & Chet Brown Applications Available**

Applications are now being accepted for this year's Outstanding 4-H Member and the Chester Brown Memorial Leadership Development Award. Applications are available on the MSU Extension website at: <a href="https://www.canr.msu.edu/isabella/isabella/county\_4\_h/newsletters-and-forms">https://www.canr.msu.edu/isabella/isabella/county\_4\_h/newsletters-and-forms</a> or at the Extension office. Completed applications are due at the Extension office by July 15, 2022. Eligibility requirements are as follows:

#### **Outstanding 4-H Member**

(winner will be selected to receive \$500 towards CWF Trip, National Club Congress Trip, or scholarship towards higher education)

- 1. Applicants must be 15 years of age (by January 1, 2022).
- 2. Completed three calendar years of 4-H club work.
- 3. Completed 4-H projects in at least two project areas.
- 4. Been recommended by local leader.
- 5. Applicants will be interviewed on Friday of fair week.

#### **Chester Brown Memorial Leadership Development Award**

- 1. Applicants must be 13 years of age (by January 1, 2022).
- 2. Applicants should demonstrate leadership abilities in an activity. This activity should not be eligible for fair exhibition. Examples of eligible activities: community service project, school related activity, church activity.
- 3. Selection will be based upon organizational skills, number of people participating, and how they were involved.
- 4. Applicants will be interviewed on Friday of fair week.

## Other 4-H Award Opportunities - you must sign up for these on your fair entry form:

#### 4-H Jr. Teen Leadership Award - Ages 10-12

- 1. Enroll in the 4-H junior leadership project with club leader and 4-H office.
- 2. Complete the self-reflection form with your 4-H leader.
- 3. Complete two or more junior leader activities (see application for suggestions)
- 4. Display a poster (28" x 22") at the fair depicting some aspect of your project.
- 5. Be interviewed by a fair judge.

#### 4-H Teen Leadership Award - Ages 13-19

For all 4-H members who have enrolled in a teen leadership project and completed it prior to the beginning of fair week. Must complete a poster (28"x22") and evaluation form available from the Extension office. Two \$50 cash awards are given.

#### Junior Achievement Booth Award - Ages 12-14

Showcase your participation in 4-H with an Achievement Booth at the fair. Guidelines and suggestions are available from the Extension office. One winner will be selected and will receive a choice of: \$125 towards a trip to Washington, DC (WOW - Wonders of Washington).

#### Senior Achievement Booth Award - Ages 15-19

Here is your opportunity to highlight your 4-H participation. Guidelines are available from the Extension office. One winner will receive a choice of: \$300 toward a trip to CWF (Citizen Washington Focus) in Washington, D.C. next summer; National Club Congress held next November in Atlanta, Georgia; or scholarship towards higher education.

**Animal Care** - All animals should be fed and watered each day by 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Your responsibility for your animal does not end after the animal is sold. Clean pens/stalls give a favorable impression to the public.

#### IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Still Exhibits will be entered on Saturday, July 23 from 9 a.m. 1 p.m.
- Still Exhibits will be released on Saturday, July 30 from 8 p.m. 10 p.m.
   \*\*\*REMINDER ALL Still Exhibits must be picked up on Saturday, July 30. If you cannot pick up your project, PLEASE make arrangements with someone to pick it up for you. Any Still Exhibits left in the barn Saturday night will be discarded.
- Large Animal Project Records must be turned in at the 4-H Still Exhibit Building on Monday, July 25 between 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. The superintendent will be present to accept project records and check off member's names from the species list, so we know you have turned in your records. Records that are to be judged will be separated from the others and judged on Tuesday morning.

#### **Small Animal Members**

Just a few reminders:

- If you plan to sell one of your animals in the Small Animal Auction, you must complete the online registration by June 20. (You may sell only one species in the Small Animal Auction - one goat, rabbit, or pen of poultry). If you have any questions about using this survey form please call or text Alissa Davis at 989-465-7279.
- Feed Records are required You have a choice of either the short Simple Form or the longer Record Sheet for each individual species which can be entered to be judged. To be considered for best feed record, you must sign up for Small Animal Project Records, under Dept. 17, Educational Science.

## Bird biosecurity reminders



With cases of highly pathogenic avian influenza on the rise, owners of poultry projects and other birds are encouraged to implement preventative measures. This includes keeping animals contained at their own facilities, as well as:

Preventing contact between domestic and wild birds by bringing them indoors or ensuring their area is enclosed.

Washing hands before and after handling birds and when moving between different coops.

Disinfecting boots and other gear when moving between coops.

Not sharing equipment or other supplies between coops or other farms.

Cleaning and disinfecting equipment and other supplies between uses.

Using well or municipal water as drinking water for birds.

Ensuring there is no contact between poultry feed/feed ingredients and wild birds or rodents.

Wearing clean clothing and footwear that has not been worn in a home coop into public venues.

If you suspect a bird in your flock may be sick with avian influenza, contact MDARD immediately at 800-292-3939 (daytime) or 517-373-0440 (after-hours). Signs of HPAI include unusual deaths, drop in egg production and significant decrease in water consumption.
