You will drop off your animals and park in the parking lot. If needed, you may drop off feed and supplies at the west end of the Livestock Arena, then move your vehicle to the parking lot.

Poultry Show Rules for 2021

- 1. All poultry exhibitors are encouraged to participate in showmanship
- 2. Showmanship classes will be broken down the following way:
 - a. Pee Wee (5-7 year old's)
 - b. Junior (8-11 year old's)
 - c. Intermediate (12-14 year old's)
 - d. Senior (15 -19 year old's)
- 3. Pee Wee's will be able to participate in showmanship only, however, you may bring your own pen of poultry or you may use another exhibitor's bird
- 4. Exhibitors allowed to participate between the ages of 5-19
- 5. Exhibitors may register / show up to 3 entries
 - a. Example: 2 pens of poultry (not in the same class) and 1 dozen of eggs
- 6. Exhibitors must be pre-registered for classes by June 20th
 - a. Register at https://isabellacofair.wixsite.com/2021/sign-up
- 7. Exhibitors must be pre-registered for the Small Animal Auction by June 20th
 - a. Register at https://isabellacofair.wixsite.com/2021/sign-up
 - b. Each exhibitor is allowed only 1 entry in the auction (example: you show 1 goat, 1 rabbit and 1 pen of poultry you can only sell 1 of the 3 items)
- 8. Poultry will be entered on Sunday, July 25 from 4:00 6:00 pm
 - a. Poultry not obtained from a pullorum free hatchery will be tested at entry at a cost of \$.50 per bird
 - b. Poultry with lice or lice eggs will be sent home
 - c. Poultry showing any signs of disease will be sent home
- 9. Show day will be on Monday, July 26 and will begin at 10:00 am
- 10. Eggs will be entered on Monday, July 26 from 8:30 9:30 am (bring your eggs in an egg carton in a cooler labeled with your name)
- 11. No feed records this year
- 12. There will be no open class entries allowed
- 13. Showmanship rosettes will be given in every class for top 10 the day of show
- 14. Trophies will be awarded and given out the day of show
- 15. Champion & Reserve Champion pens must be sold in the auction
- 16. All pens registered for the auction must stay on the fairgrounds through the auction
- 17. Exhibitors are required to care for their animals
 - a. They must clean the tray, feed and water their animals daily by 10:00 a.m. and again by 7:00 p.m.
 - b. Food containers and poultry feed will be provided
 - c. Exhibitors are responsible for providing an appropriate water container for their poultry
- 18. All poultry needs to be dusted for lice 6 weeks, 4 weeks, and 2 weeks prior to fair
- 19. All poultry exhibited at fair needs to bathed 24 hours prior to entry
- 20. Pens NOT registered for the auction will be released on Monday, July 26 approximately between 7-8 pm (time subject to change)
- 21. Required show dress attire is long sleeved white shirt with long dark pants and closed toed shoes
- 22. State / Local Health Department face mask guidelines will be applicable

Goat Show Rules for 2021

- 1. All Goat exhibitors are encouraged to participate in showmanship
- 2. Showmanship classes will be broken down the following way:
 - a. Pee Wee (5-7 year old's)
 - b. Junior (8-11 year old's)
 - c. Intermediate (12-14 year old's)
 - d. Senior (15 -19 year old's)
- 3. Exhibitors may register / show up to 4 entries.
- 4. Exhibitors must be pre-registered by June 20th.
- 5. Exhibitors must be pre-registered for the Small Animal Auction by June 20th
 - a. Each exhibitor is allowed only 1 entry in the auction (example: you show 1 goat, 1 rabbit and 1 pen of poultry you can only sell 1 of the 3 items)
- 6. Show day will be on Wednesday, July 28 at 9:30am registration is 8am-9am
 - a. Vet check is \$.50 per goat
 - b. Goats with lice, lice eggs or lumps or bumps will be sent home
 - c. Goats showing any signs of disease will be sent home
 - d. Any wethers that do not have a scrapie tag will not be able to show or sell.
- 7. Feed records are NOT required this year
- 8. There will be no open class entries allowed this year
- 9. Showmanship rosettes will be given in every class for top 10 the day of show
- 10. Trophies will be awarded and given out the day of show
- 11. Champion & Reserve Champion market doe's and wethers must be sold in the auction
- 12. All goats registered for the auction must stay on the fairgrounds through the auction. All others go home after the show.
- 13. Exhibitors are required to care for their animals
 - a. They must clean the pens, feed and water their animals daily by 10:00 a.m. and again by 7:00 p.m.
- 14. Exhibitors are responsible for providing an appropriate water and food containers for their goats no hay on the ground.
- 15. State / Local Health Department face make guidelines will be applicable

2021 Isabella County Rabbit Youth Show Rules

Pre-show day:

- Youth ages 5-19 can register to show
- Register at https://isabellacofair.wixsite.com/2021/sign-up
- Exhibitors may show up to 3 entries (a market pen counts as 1 entry); any combination of classes (i.e. 2 senior bucks, 1 junior doe)
- Rabbits must be free of disease & must have an identification permanent tattoo in their left ear
- Must be registered by Sunday, June 20 (this deadline also applies to all other small animals and the auction)

Show day rules:

- Show day is Tuesday, July 27
- Check in is 7:30-8am; Show begins at 8:30am
- Must be checked in by 8am to compete in showmanship
- Pedigree for rabbits being sold in the auction must be turned in on show day
- Showmanship is optional but strongly encouraged as this is not a 4-H show
- Exhibitors who participate in showmanship should wear closed-toe shoes, dark pants and a long sleeve white shirt.
- There will be no open class; this is only a youth show
- There will be no feed records
- There will be no mixed breed class; all breeds will show and be judged according to the American Rabbit Breeders Association's Standard of Perfection.
- All animals must be brought in an all-day/show-length appropriate container. Contact show superintendents if this is a problem. No rabbits will be staying on the fairgrounds after the show. Rabbits being sold in the auction will be brought back to the fairgrounds on Wednesday evening.
- Showmanship classes will be broken down by age: Pre-Junior (5-7), Junior (8-11), Intermediate (12-14), Senior (15-19)
- Awards for showmanship: Rosettes for top 10 in every class, trophies for the Grand & Reserve Champion of each age group.
- Awards for breed class: A, B, C ribbons awarded to each animal exhibited. Based on the number of entries, top 6 breeds shown receive both Best of Breed and Best Opposite of Breed trophies. The next down 3-4 breeds will receive Best of Breed trophy. All other breeds will receive Best of Breed rosettes.

- 1. Show day will be on Thursday, July 29.
 - Animals will be entered from 2:00-2:30 pm on that day, with the show following immediately at 2:30 pm. Animals will be taken home immediately following the show.
- 2. Exhibitors must be pre-registered by June 20th
- 3. Exhibitors may register / show up to 3 entries
- 4. Classes will be broken down the following way:
 - a. Pee Wee (5-7 years old)
 - b. Junior (8-11 years old)
 - c. Intermediate (12-14 years old)


Exhibitor info

- Auction is Wednesday, July 28 at 6:30pm in the Large Animal Pavilion
- Register at https://isabellacofair.wixsite.com/2021/sign-up
- Must be registered by Sunday, June 20
- Exhibitors selling rabbits turn in the pedigree on show day (we may ask for proof of pedigree before show day)
- All exhibitors are strongly encouraged to personally invite buyers to the auction
- Animals must be shown in their appropriate show (Poultry on Monday, Rabbits on Tuesday, Goats on Wednesday) in order to sell
- Exhibitors may only sell one animal (unless multiple grand/reserve awards are won)
- We are encouraging buyers to take home purchased animals on auction night. We'll be checking out animals until 11pm.
- Grand Champions and Reserve Champions from the poultry, rabbit and goat shows
 must be sold in the auction. These animals will be added to the sale after judging if they
 were not already registered for the sale. If an exhibitor wins in multiple species, they will
 sell multiple animals.
- Animals disqualified in any of the poultry, rabbit or goat shows will be removed from the auction.
- Exhibitors who sell will receive 90% of the highest bid for their animal. The remaining 10% will go back to the organization hosting the auction.



Michigan 4-H eliminates 4-H participation fee

It is with great enthusiasm that MSU Extension has eliminated the 4-H participation fee beyond the current program year. The fee was not collected in 2020-2021 in consideration of the financial strain put on some families due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This pause gave the organization an opportunity to reflect on how it can best reach all audiences. Despite best efforts, this fee has been a barrier for some. By removing the fee indefinitely, MSU Extension feels it can best bring the power of 4-H to all young people in Michigan.

MSU Extension 4-H program coordinators played a large role in leading MSU Extension through this decision. These professionals serve alongside youth across the state and have been champions for removing the participation fee in an effort to better reach under-served audiences in rural, urban and suburban communities.

It is important to note that enhancements previously supported by 4-H participation fee funds, including 4-H grants, awards and scholarships, and supplemental accidental insurance for 4-H youth and volunteers, will continue. Michigan 4-H has identified alternative funding sources that can support these and other local and state programing initiatives previously enhanced by participation fee dollars. This includes endowments, grants, reallocating funds formerly used for 4-H participation fee scholarships and other methods. The quality and quantity of programming offered by Michigan 4-H will not be diminished as a result of the participation fee dissolution.

The last 15 months have been difficult. MSU Extension is excited to once again offer face-to-face programs in local communities and hopes this new policy will provide the current and future 4-H community with new and improved opportunities to grow with 4-H.

Lifting In-Person Restrictions

Earlier this week, Michigan State University removed many of their remaining COVID-19 rules in alignment with the current re-opening of the state announced on June 22. As a result, MSU Extension will no longer have any face-to-face requirements or require approvals for in-person 4-H meetings, activities or events. Michigan 4-H clubs and groups may now meet in-person as desired! Please continue to keep a record of attendance with contact information for each in-person engagement, via meeting minutes, registration, attendance log or other methods.

Volunteers who have not already done so will need to be in active status in Volunteer Central before re-engaging, but the Communicating Through Conflict training module is no longer required. Please contact Kristi (schrei61@msu.edu) if you have questions about your current volunteer status.

While not a requirement, Michigan 4-H volunteers hosting in-person events are still encouraged to continue following best practices that allow individuals to increase their comfort level with meeting in person. This includes meeting outside when possible, keeping participant numbers below maximum capacity to allow for social distancing, offering hand sanitizer at touch points, frequently sanitizing surfaces and respecting the continued use of masks by those who choose to wear them. Flexibility continues to be key and groups should continue to provide options (including virtual) for participation to ensure all participants can remain involved given their individual circumstances.

It has been a very long road for our 4-H community since the COVID-19 pandemic landed on our doorsteps last March. In 4-H, learning never stops. We are thankful to have worked virtually with thousands of youth and volunteers over the last year and are very excited to now see you again at in-person 4-H events!


