Junior 4-H Royal Ambassador **Team Criteria**



Age: 8-14 by January 1st of the current year.



Enrolled in an Isabella County 4-H club for two or more years, which may include cloverbud years.



Complete the Junior 4-H Royal Ambassador Packet



Recommendation Form completed by a current Isabella County 4-H Leader who is not a relative.



Complete a typed 1–2-page Essay (double spaced) about your experience as a 4-H Member of Isabella County, how would you recruit young kids to join the 4-H community, what ways could you make a difference for the Isabella County Fair, and why would you like to be Isabella County Junior Royal Ambassador?



Turn in a completed hand-written Application Form, Leader Recommendation Form, Personal Information Sheet, and Essay to the 4-H Extension Office by May 1st, 2023.



Prepare a visual aid depicting your 4-H involvement, which you will share with the evaluating Panel Interview on June 4th, 2023, at Maranantha Baptist Church.

Helpful Hints and Information

- Complete the entire 4-H Ambassador Application packet in your hand writing; completely
 answer all questions listed and read each item carefully. The Leader Recommendation Form
 should be completed by a 4-H leader in Isabella County knows you well, who is not a relative.
 These forms should be turned in to the 4-H Extension office by 4:00 pm, May 1st, 2023. Since
 paperwork may need to be mailed. Ask a leader soon, so they have enough time to complete –
 don't wait until three or four days before the packet is due there won't be enough time to
 complete it.
- When working on your essay, ensure that you are hitting all the requirements, the essay needs to be 1-2 pages, double-spaced, and Times New Roman, answering the questions that are on pages 2 and 3(1. Your experience as a 4-H Member, 2. How you would get kids to join the 4-H Program, 3. Differences that you can make for the Isabella County Fair, and 4. Why would you like to be Isabella County Junior Royal Ambassador?) Make sure you proofread your work and submit your essay with the application Packet when turning it in to the 4-H Extension office.
- 3. Develop a visual aid that shows what 4-H means to you. Bring the visual aid to your interview on June 4th, 2023. It may include pictures/brochures from 4-H events you have attended, accomplishments at the fair, or your future 4-H plans. The display should be organized, clean, creative, and positive. You will use this as a guide through your interview. The sky's the limit! Show your style and take pride in it.
- 4. Participate in a personal interview on June 4th, 2023. Dress nicely and neatly; we suggest you not wear jeans, shorts, t-shirts, tank tops, or flip-flops. You want to make a very positive first impression when you step into the room to meet with the judges -- dress for success! You will have approximately nine minutes (which may increase depending on the number of applicants) in which to describe/discuss your visual aid, and the judges will ask you some questions. Practice with someone ahead of time and be yourself. Let the judges get a chance to know you, and show them why you would be a GREAT 4-H Ambassador!
- 5. Most important is to have FUN!

 - b. Assist at the Still Exhibit Auction, Small Animal Auction, Large Animal Auction, and Awards Program these are all **required** events during fair week.
 - c. The team *may* attend one of the grand stand events, to be determined by the program coordinators.
 - d. Participate in Goat Milking, Dairy Hand Milking, Baby Calf Parade, and Pedal Pullers Competition.
 - e. Be present at small and large animal showmanship events to lead pledges and
 - f. pass out awards.

 - a. Attending 4-H Banquets.
