

Commonly asked questions

- **Q**: How old do kids have to be to get into 4-H?
- **A:** 4-H programs are open to all people from 5 to 19 years of age.
- **Q:** How much does it cost to join 4-H?
- A: 4-H does not have a participation fee to join. Individual clubs may charge dues to cover expenses and some project areas, such as photography and livestock, may require extra investments for supplies and equipment.
- **Q:** We live in the city. Can my kids still join 4-H?
- A: 4-H programs are open to all young people, no matter where they live. There are programs in every county in Michigan. Some projects that are especially well suited to city areas include community beautification, dog obedience, drama, food and nutrition, gardening and computer science.
- **Q:** I want my kids to be included in 4-H, how do we join?
