For the 2023 fair -

- ❖ Youth may enter one carcass per species and all carcasses will sell in the auction (goats, sheep, swine and beef)
- ❖ Youth may sell up to a total of 8 auction sales



As of this program year, youth are required to attend YQCA (Youth Quality Care for Animals) meetings and will receive a certification to show at the Kalamazoo County Fair and Family Festival. YQCA meetings will be held on:

April 5 & June 8 in Room B at the Fairgroundsall at 6:30 PM.

Pre-registration is required at the <u>YQCA website</u> prior to attending. The registration fee is \$3.00 and you will need to take the pretest for your age group. There is a YQCA online version, if you prefer. The cost for the online class is \$12.00 per youth. Attending this training will count toward your project meeting requirements.



This event will take place at the Gaylord University Center 80 Livingston Blvd Gaylord Michigan 49735.

The Michigan Youth Livestock Conference will provide new opportunities to Michigan youth who are interested in or passionate about raising, exhibiting, producing, or showing livestock. This event is open to all youth and is geared towards those ages 9-19. *Registration is through 4-H Online*. Space is limited. Registration for this event will open January 17th and close February 21st







4-H Mark of Excellence Contest.

NEW, this year youth can submit either a video submission or a short journal reflection focusing on the theme

"Because of 4-H I can!"

What is the Mark of Excellence Contest:

The 4-H Mark of Excellence contest is an introductory opportunity for the Michigan 4-H State Awards program for youth ages 11 and 12.

Eligibility for this contest is as follows tween the ages of 11 and 12 as of January 1, 2023. Enrollment in previous years is not required.

- Individuals may only be selected for this award once.
- Each county can select up to two (2) winners to receive the Mark of Excellence Award each year. Submission Details:
- Contestants are asked to create either a video or a journal reflection focusing around the theme of "Because of 4-H I can..."
- Entries should be legible or easily viewable and turned into the Kalamazoo County office by April 1st
- Video submissions must be no more than 2 minutes in length. Videos should be in mp4 format or provide a YouTube Channel link.
- Journal reflections must be 500 words or less and can be hand-written or typed.
- Submission can be either video OR journal.
- Must include name and county.

Selection:

Individuals may only be selected for this award once. Each county will have the opportunity to select up to two winning recipients. County winner names and materials will be forwarded to the State 4-H Awards Committee. Winning entries wil receive a certificate and medal as well as may receive other recognition locally. County winners and materials are required to be submitted to the State 4-H Award Committee via the link below no later than April 14, 2023. County 4-H Staff are responsible for notifying their winners of selection.



Mark of Excellence Timeline:

April 1: Mark of Excellence Entries are due to local county 4-H offices

April 1-10: County 4-H staff coordinate selection committee to select two winning entries from their county

April 14: County 4-H staff submit the county submission form electronically

April 14: County 4-H Staff will notify submission pool of winning selected submissions

May - June: Awards will be mailed directly to youth

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards



(13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.
