Teachers, librarians, and other youth development professionals! You can also win a \$25 gift card if you referred a non-related youth to the contest and they win! There is a limit of one gift card per referring adult.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE:

- You must sign up by April 13, 2023, at <u>https://events.anr.msu.edu/Money2023/</u> to be eligible for prizes. If a teacher, librarian, or other youth development professional referred you to this contest, you will want to include their name and email for their chance to win a prize too!

- 5. Complete the challenge using the code by April 30, 2023, at midnight ET. The contest involves answering 30 multiple choice questions around credit. It will take approximately 20 minutes to complete.
- 6. High scoring youth will be entered into a prize drawing to win a \$25 gift card. A maximum of 10 youth winners will be selected.
- 7. Winners will be notified by May 8, 2023.

The camp will be held July 23-29 on the shores of Lake Esau at Camp Chickagami in Presque Isle. This pre-college program is for teens who will be age 13 to 15 during camp.

During this enriching MSU Extension educational program, campers will increase their science literacy and stewardship as they learn from natural resource experts in fields such as Great Lakes coastal and fisheries management, limnology, wildlife, forestry, geography, geology and environmental education. In addition to hands-on learning, attendees will also enjoy exciting natural resources recreation activities such as kayaking, snorkeling, sailing, fossil hunting, archery, photography, and evenings around a campfire. First-time campers also go charter fishing and learn

Participants who will enter eighth, ninth, tenth and eleventh grades after attending 4-H Exploration Days are eligible for nomination to apply for a \$2,000 MSU Pre-College Scholarship. 4-H Exploration Days participants will be invited to apply for nomination by writing an essay.
