## What I love about fair in the course of a day ...

- 1. The stillness in the morning as kids one by one emerge from campers with their bedhead hair to check their animal's feed, water, and bedding before they meet their own needs.
- 2. The families sitting in the stands together supporting their kids as they show their animals. Grandparents, parents, siblings, cousins, friends... The results are the same whether they placed last or first, the look of pride on their faces. There is no yelling from the stands at the judge or dirty plays. You know which kid belongs to which crowd as every kid sneaks a peek to their family as the judge turns away.
- 3. People helping each other... experienced members and families helping the "newbies" learn how to ready an animal to show, fix a loose back number, parents running to the camper for an "extra" something that is needed. An older member helping a young member when an animal gets loose. (There is nothing better than a loose chicken and 20 kids work together without a word to catch a very agile bird). The congratulations from a competitor.
- 4. The fair food is always a treat but the sweetest is watching an elderly couple share a moment and an ice cream on a bench, a child giving the last of a cotton candy to a younger sibling that they bought with their own money, the whole family sitting together...
- 5. The high fives, the wiping of tears, the hugs, the friends walking side by side, the old fair friends reconnecting...

The world needs County fairs. It reminds us of the good in our world when so much negative is shown on media.

6. The stillness that returns as the general public leaves the grounds, kids playing football in the open spaces between campers, the laugher of friends and families sitting reviewing the days activities, kids wandering to the bathroom in their "jammies" before collapsing in a camper bunk, the teenagers sitting in lawn chairs playing cards late in the night...

We are all busy, but if you have a moment, just soak it all in.



You must have a profit and loss statement filled out per Project Record Book Requirements.

## 2023 Michigan 4-H State Award winners announced

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program recognized outstanding 4-H members during the opening session of 4-H Exploration Days on June 22. At the event, honorees had the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments with their fellow 4-H Exploration Days participants.

A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on Michigan 4-H members and recognizes a level of excellence in learning, leadership and service. In total, 22 4-H members from 15 counties submitted applications to take part is this year's program.



"All of our 4-H'ers across the state are amazing but the youth honored with 4-H State Awards are some of our most accomplished," said Julie Chapin, state 4-H leader for Michigan and director of MSU Extension's children and youth programs. "They have demonstrated their dedication to improving themselves and their communities through 4-H, service and more."

Michigan 4-H State Awards were presented in 13 of the 20 available award categories that showcase the diverse array of 4-H knowledge, skills and experience. Recipients of the 2023 awards are:

- Environmental Science: Amanda Towne of Van Buren County (senior division)
- Gardening and Horticulture: Katie Miller of Eaton County (junior division)

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is open to 4-H members who are 13-19 years old with three or more years of 4-H experience. To qualify for the award, 4-H'ers must submit a written application that showcases the learning experiences, knowledge and skills they've acquired through their participation in 4-H, as well as their contributions to their local 4-H programs, clubs and communities. Submissions are reviewed by the Michigan 4-H State Awards selection committee. This group of volunteers, staff members and industry experts determine which members are selected as award finalists. All applicants receive written feedback from selection committees.

In addition to a plaque, each 4-H State Award winner in the senior division will also receive a \$200 cash award; junior winners receive \$50 cash awards. These awards are made possible by generous donations to the Michigan 4-H Foundation.
