The 4-H Global Table is intended to provide youth, 11-18 years old, from Michigan & Kentucky with the opportunity to experience the food cultures of different countries and connect with young people from across the world. This connection will be centered around their common passion for food.

As part of the 4-H Global Table virtual program, young people from Michigan & Kentucky will be exchanging recipes with young people in Taiwan, Papua New Guinea, The Netherlands, or Argentina. Additionally, young people will prepare recipes provided to them by their counterparts from the young person they are paired with and share their experience at the ending celebration via zoom.

Youth will receive weekly prompts to communicate with the other youth to learn about the other youth and their culture.








Updates for 2023!

- ❖ Youth may sell up to a total of 8 auction sales





As we start to think ahead to the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

Resolve that:

- Club meetings will start and end on time.
- Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
- All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
- 4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
- Fun will be included in each meeting.
- A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
- The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
- New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H questions.
- The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
- Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.
