





MSU Extension | Volunteer Central

MSU Extension launches new portal for volunteers in 2020!

In early 2020, MSU Extension launched a statewide volunteer management database and screening system called Volunteer Central. https://msu.samaritan.com/ custom/502/#/volunteer home

Volunteers are the core of many MSU Extension programs and the most essential partners MSU Extension has. As such, the organization has made a major investment into Volunteer Central in an effort to improve processes for both staff and volunteers. In the new system, volunteers will enjoy improved features including easy-to-read dashboards and a one-stop application process, among other advantages.



A unique feature of Volunteer Central is that each volunteer will have their own unique online account and profile. Unlike 4-H Online, family profiles will not be permitted. This is necessary to protect the confidentiality of each volunteer and the integrity of data in the system. In preparation for integration to Volunteer Central, those who currently share an email address with another 4-H volunteer should make plans to create a separate email address for each shared user. For those who may need help with this task: holiday time with family, friends or neighbors is a great opportunity to ask for assistance in this area.

Once you have created a new email address, please either:

- 1. Log in to 4-HOnline and add the newly created email address to the volunteer with whom it should be associated; or
- 2. Contact your local 4-H program coordinator and share the newly created email address and the volunteer with whom the account should be associated.

The email addresses in 4-H Online and shared with 4-H program coordinators will be used to create access accounts for current volunteers in Volunteer Central. In the coming weeks, look for additional information about Volunteer Central and when current volunteers will have access to the system. In the meantime, please contact your local 4-H program coordinator with any questions or concerns.







4-H Teen Leader Project



For the purpose of using the 4-H Teen Leadership materials, a 4-H teen leader will be defined as a young person who is:

- Between the ages of 13 and 19 years old by January 1 of the program year.
- Learning and developing leadership skills.
- Using his or her knowledge, skills and abilities to set and meet goals.
- Getting others involved in projects or activities.
- Practicing and applying leadership skills in various settings.
- Reflecting on his or her leadership experiences.

There are already several youth in the county who are holding the unofficial role of teen leader. Our goal this year is to have youth make it official and help to build those leadership roles they hold in their clubs and projects. Youth will complete an application and interview with 4-H staff and will attend upcoming trainings to help build their skills.

4-H Renewable Energy Camp




From July 6-10, 2020, the 4-H Renewable Energy Camp will take place at Michigan State University (MSU). This five-day pre-college program is available to youth ages 13-15 who are interested in exploring ideas, research and opportunities related to renewable energy.

chigan state university During this camp, the youth will visit labs that are conducting renewable energy research, renewable energy companies that think outside the box, and

farms that are using renewable energy to remain profitable. The interactive camp will engage youth in experiments, questions and conversations focused on the application of solar radiation into electricity. The culmination of the week will be youth teams designing solutions for incorporating solar energy into real-life applications. The cost for this camp is \$280 for 4-H youth.
