We are excited to be back on MSU's campus this June for Exploration Days!

Anticipated registration opening is mid-April and will be done on a first come first served basis. The session listing has been posted on the [website](#) (under Participant Information). This is a great resource for families and youth serving organizations who might send youth. Please consider sharing the [Exploration Days Facebook page](#) post on your social media platforms for youth who may not 4-H members.

Key points on sessions:

- Sessions have different age requirements or are more advanced. Some sessions are duplicated (asterisks next to session title) and so youth can choose which time slot they want to attend that topic. It is important that youth consider those two items when making choices.
- There are also different maximum number of participants. While those maximums are not listed on the document, participants may want to have 2nd, 3rd and 4th choice in case a session they have interest in becomes full.

Some sessions also have other considerations such as downloading an app or wearing long-sleeves or closed toed shoes. Reminders to youth will be sent through the registration system to those enrolled in those sessions, however, it is good to note that when looking at sessions, too.

This is a great opportunity for youth to try something new! Michigan 4-H Exploration Days is an opportunity to gain new skills and perhaps challenge the comfort zone. This is a wonderful opportunity for youth to attend sessions that might help them experience a career path that might interest them or grow in their personal development.

The registration number is 1000 youth participants with volunteers, staff and other adults making up the remaining registration numbers, bringing us to the estimated total of 1500 total attendees on campus. There will be a waiting list for youth.



Avian influenza confirmed in MI wild birds Infected birds found in Macomb, Monroe and St. Clair counties

PUBLISHED ON **March 25, 2022** ANSING, Mich. — The Michigan Department of Natural Resources announced March 24 that highly pathogenic avian influenza is now confirmed in the state’s wild bird population. The disease was identified in free-ranging Canada geese and tundra swans from St. Clair County, in snowy owls from Macomb County and in a mute swan from Monroe County. Avian influenza is a virus that can infect both free-ranging and domestic poultry such as chickens, turkeys, quail, geese and swans.

Six Canada geese and two tundra swans collected last week at St. Clair Flats State Wildlife Area and two snowy owls from Macomb County were delivered to the DNR’s Wildlife Disease Laboratory for necropsy. Initial testing was performed at Michigan State University’s Veterinary Diagnostic Lab. These tests were non-negative, and the samples forwarded to the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s National Veterinary Services Lab in Ames, Iowa, for final confirmation. The DNR received confirmation Thursday, March 24, the geese, swans and owls were infected with highly pathogenic avian influenza, subtype H5N1. An additional positive case was identified in a mute swan from Monroe County on March 15.

This disease detection comes after the state’s first HPAI detection in a backyard, non-commercial poultry flock in Kalamazoo County in late February 2022. The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development has continued to urge poultry owners to step up their own biosecurity precautions by minimizing the number of people coming in contact with birds, isolating birds from wild birds whenever possible, and disinfecting hands and clothing after coming in contact with poultry.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention considers the risk to people from HPAI viruses to be low. To date, no human HPAI infections have been detected in the United States. Avian influenza has been found in backyard poultry flocks, commercial flocks and in wild birds.

With this type of highly pathogenic avian influenza, there may be an absence of many of the routine signs of illness in domestic poultry. Sudden death and high death losses are major indicators of HPAI. However, sick birds may experience neurological signs; difficulty walking; lack of appetite, energy or vocalization; significant drop in egg production; swollen combs, wattles, legs or head; diarrhea; or nasal discharge, sneezing or coughing.

Wild birds commonly have avian influenza and sometimes spread it to domestic birds through direct or indirect transmission. Ducks and geese are considered carriers; however, geese generally do not pass it on.

Residents who notice the death loss of three or more free-ranging birds should report it to the DNR through the [Eyes in the Field app](#) or by calling 517-336-5030. If your domestic poultry is experiencing severe illness or multiple death losses, contact MDARD at 800-292-3939.

How to Recognize a Sick Bird

It’s important to be able to recognize the symptoms of avian influenza.

Sick birds may experience...

- Sudden death
- Significant drop in water consumption
- Lack of appetite, energy, or vocalization
- Drop in egg production
- Diarrhea
- Swollen comb, wattles, legs, or head
- Nasal discharge, sneezing, or coughing
- Abnormal behavior like difficulty walking

For the last 2 years the meeting attendance requirement has been waived but the **requirement for three meetings is now back in place.**



Cost: \$1,895 + airfare estimate (\$1,300 - \$2,000) + \$50 travel agent fee
(Airfare varies based upon applicant's location)



Delegates will stay in group accommodations in Córdoba, Argentina (arranged by Argentina 4-H) for the duration of the program. Each day, participants will engage in a variety of structured group activities facilitated by Argentina 4-H, including cultural excursions, Spanish language activities, and participation in local 4-H activities. This program model will allow participants to lead, learn, and grow as a cohort throughout their international experience. Particular emphasis will be placed on soccer and orchestra, two of Argentina 4-H's primary youth activities.

About Argentina 4-H

Argentina 4-H is a non-profit organization located in Córdoba, Argentina that develops programs to support under-served youth in the local community. In particular, their youth programs focus on:

- ⇒ A music academy using recycled instruments. This program develops environmental awareness, confidence, and leadership skills in participants
- ⇒ A soccer club for local youth to develop leadership skills, teamwork, and healthy habits

4MSU Masking Guidelines Lifted

In early March, Michigan State



University (MSU) updated their COVID-19 mask guidance. These changes impact attendees of MSU Extension and Michigan 4-H programs occurring on and off MSU property.

As of March 8, masks are no longer required at MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H programs, events, offices or meeting rooms.

While not a requirement, Michigan 4-H in-person events are still encouraged to follow best practices that include meeting outside when possible, keeping participant numbers below maximum capacity to allow for social distancing, offering hand sanitizer and respecting the continued use of masks by those who choose to wear them.
