#### 4-H SPIN Clubs

4-H SPIN Clubs stand for "Special Interest" clubs. They are short term clubs that span approximately 6-8 weeks in length. Youth, along with an adult mentor or volunteer, meet 1-2 times per week and focus on a specific topic for the duration of the program. Examples include, but are not limited to, coding, emergency preparedness, gardening, photography, and so much more! These clubs are a great way for youth to dive deeply into a topic of interest in an environment that fosters fun, hands-on, experiential learning. This form of 4-H participation is a great avenue for those who are new to 4-H, or for those who have been long time 4-H members.
