#### **Ambassador Applications Re-opened**



Are you interested in being an ambassador for Lapeer County 4-H but missed the application deadline?

There are currently 4 vacancies for Senior and Junior 4-H Ambassadors and several available spots on Cloverbud Court in Lapeer County. Additional Applications will be accepted until January 2, 2024. Applications are available on the Lapeer County 4-H website or by emailing Sarah at graversa@msu.edu

4-H ambassadors represent and promote 4-H, as well as assist with county-wide or statewide 4-H activities. A 4-H Ambassador is a motivated individual who seeks to become a leader, mentor and teacher, inspiring positive change in their community. As an ambassador you will participate in community events and parades, meet with community partners, share your 4-H story with Commissioners and more.

#### **Educational Trip Scholarships Available**

Through the Lapeer County 4-H Awards Program, 4-H'ers are eligible for Educational Trip Scholarships. Interested youth must complete a County Awards Application found on the "County Awards Program" page on the website and participate in an interview. One youth per trip is selected to receive a scholarship, however any 4-H youth may still attend the trip at their own expense. **The application deadline for these trips has been extended until January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024**. Applications are available on the Lapeer County 4-H website or by emailing Sarah at graversa@msu.edu.

4-H CAPITOL EXPERIENCE: (Lansing, MI): Typically, 4-day conference held in March, that helps prepare youth for active citizenship by focusing on civic engagement and public policy. Teen 4-H Members (grades 9-12) from around the state converge in Lansing, Michigan to experience state government in action and learn how they can influence policy issues. Participants interact with legislators, state agency staff, lobbyists, and other resource people to learn how policy is made. This trip generally costs \$300-\$500. Applicants will be applying for a full scholarship less \$50 deposit. \$50 deposit is required with application. Deposit check will be returned to applicants not receiving the award.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE: (Arlington, Virginia) This trip is only offered every other year. National 4-H Conference is the pinnacle experience in 4-H Civic Engagement, providing the opportunity for young people to connect, learn, engage, lead, and impact their communities, nation, and world. At the conference in April 2024, delegates (ages 15-19) will have the opportunity to participate in round table discussions, present to federal partner agencies, and engage with their U.S. Senators and Representatives. This trip costs approx. \$2,000, Applicants will be applying for a full scholarship less \$250 delegate costs. \$50 deposit is required and will be applied towards the \$250 delegate's cost. Deposit check will be returned to applicants not receiving the award. Applicants for this trip **must also apply** for the Conference scholarship available through the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA). That application deadline is **January 1**. Please email Sarah for the link to that scholarship application.

NATIONAL 4-H CONGRESS: 4-H'er must be 14-18 years (4-H age) on Jan. 1 of this current 4-H year. National 4-H Congress is 4-H's national leadership development workshop beginning the day after Thanksgiving in a different city every year. This is a 5-day workshop where teens from around U.S. learn more about issues related to youth and develop skills to be citizen leaders. It includes town hall meetings, service projects, science and technology literacy and more. \$50 deposit is required with application.. Applicant receiving the award will be given that \$50 as spending money at the Congress, the trip is paid for in full. Deposit check will be returned to other applicants.
