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4-H Tractor Safety Class a Success





Our 16 youth all successfully passed their tractor safety driving and written tests this month, after taking part in our in-person offering of the course. Four class sessions were held on Sunday afternoons, taught by our new lead instructor Mark Miezio, and assisted by our other new 4-H volunteer/instructor, Clint Warren, on the driving day, and then all of the youth signed up for testing slots out at the Northwest Michigan Horticulture Research Center here in Leelanau County. All of the teens were offered the chance to hop on a tractor prior to the testing day, to get some practice in, and everyone also got the chance to look at a tractor up close to see how it worked, what to do to safely start and stop it, and so on. The test day was a mild and beautiful day in May, and I spent much of the time being extremely impressed with these 14- and 15-year-old youth and their willingness to learn new skills and demonstrate what they have learned. About eight of the teens had never been on a tractor before, but they did so well! And, this course would not be a success without the use of the Horticulture Research Center—they lent us two John Deere tractors, equipment, and the use of their beautiful meeting room for our class meetings and written test time. This is a great partnership that we have had for a very long time.





4-H Hoverball Archery for MakerFest 2022 at the Traverse City Civic Center







Leelanau County 4-H joined Benzie and Grand Traverse County 4-H to provide a really fun five-hour exhibit at this year's MakerFest 2022 held at the Civic Center in Traverse City in April. Our Michigan 4-H Shooting Sports program has a 4-H inflatable hoverball archery set that can be checked out and used for promotional events, such as this one focusing on local entities that provide learning around STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math). Hoverball definitely does all of that and more! We also had the help of our Leelanau County 4-H teen leader, Everett Howell, who worked hard to keep the targets floating (on a very windy day). We reached well over 100 people during the event, and it allowed people to have a very safe introduction to archery, without the pointed edge of the arrows. Foam-tipped arrows were used with the bows, and we had youth four and up trying it out (and being very successful). One of the other participants providing activities came over to us toward the end of the event and said, "You are the most popular thing here today! Everyone kept talking about how much fun they had doing the hoverball archery."

Bird biosecurity reminders



With cases of highly pathogenic avian influenza on the rise, owners of poultry projects and other birds are encouraged to implement preventative measures. This includes keeping animals contained at their own facilities, as well as:

Preventing contact between domestic and wild birds by bringing them indoors or ensuring their area is enclosed.

Washing hands before and after handling birds and when moving between different coops.

Disinfecting boots and other gear when moving between coops.

Not sharing equipment or other supplies between coops or other farms.

Cleaning and disinfecting equipment and other supplies between uses.

Using well or municipal water as drinking water for birds.

Ensuring there is no contact between poultry feed/feed ingredients and wild birds or rodents.

Wearing clean clothing and footwear that has not been worn in a home coop into public venues.
