The Michigan 4-H Key Club Award

This is the highest 4-H honor presented to an individual at the county level. The teen needs to be 16 years of age by January 1st of the current year, completed 3 years of club work, completed 4-H projects in at least two different project areas, served as a Teen Leader, and participated in three regional and/or state 4-H events. The winner received a trophy, Key Club jewelry, a certificate, and a \$50 Amazon gift card.

As part of her award application, the winner wrote a very heartfelt essay, and I would like to share part of it with you to demonstrate why she won this award.

"My experience in 4-H provided me the opportunity to grow as an individual, pushing me to become more outgoing and allowing me to gain confidence in social situations. This caused me to seek out learning opportunities, such as obtaining an internship at a local veterinary hospital and becoming more confident in daily life. 4-H taught me to work as a team and to be a leader. I was able to expand my confidence from myself to my group members, allowing us all to collectively grow. My 4-H experience also exposed me to horses, which helped me discover my love of animals and an interest in science. This led me to pursue veterinary medicine as a possible career and a certification in equine massage, which I expect to have in the next several months. My 4-H experience made me realize how many opportunities I have in daily life to learn and pursue my interests. It taught me I can always learn more."

Leelanau County 4-H Club of the Year Award

She took on a judging role in the barn, too. She brought family to help show more animals at more petting zoos, and then she said yes to coming to this past fall's school farm markets. Then she helped at the Halloween event at the Government Center. She then said she would help at a new event at St. Mary School, the Provemont Holiday Craft Show, and when I called in sick, she saved the day, brought her sister along, and worked with over 40 youth and their families on about six different fun holiday crafts. 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Leelanau County 4-H iPad Collection Being Used at Suttons Bay Public Schools

We are very excited to have our classroom iPad and Apple Pencil collection being used by two teachers and their students at Suttons Bay Public Schools this spring!

Mary Hall and Elizabeth Richards will be using the "Everyone Can Create" curriculum presented by Apple with their students, and youth will all have the opportunity to use an iPad to learn about music and art in more hands-on and tech-savvy ways. We provided a charging cart, 25 iPads, Apple Pencils, and a classroom set of headphones for the teachers to use. We can't wait to see what these students learn and create in 2023!





Leelanau County 4-H Tractor Safety Program

Teens can improve their chances of employment this summer by completing this course. For 14 & 15 year old youth, and must be 14 by June 1st, 2023. Space is limited! Follows Purdue Extension's "Gearing Up for Safety: Production Agriculture Safety Training for Youth" curriculum. Where: Northwest Michigan Horticulture Research Center, Sundays, May 7th, 21st, 28th, from 3-5 pm, and a written and driving test day on Sunday, June 4th, with a rain date of June 11th. Testing day will be by appointment, between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. The cost per student will be \$60, and includes the classes, curriculum binder, certificate, and snacks on test day. Some scholarships are available. The flyer and registration link will be sent out soon.







4-H Exploration Days
on the MSU Campus

This pre-college program held on the MSU campus June 21-23, 2023, will be open for registration in just a few weeks! Leelanau County scholarships are available, and all 4-H adult volunteers will have their fees paid for. We will take two school buses round-trip so that families don't have to worry about transportation.

Want to go with a friend? Sign up together and ask to share a dorm room!

- There'll be more than 100 session choices held on and off campus. You'll choose two or three for your three-day stay.
- You'll live in a Michigan State University dorm and eat in the cafeteria—just like MSU students do.
- Sessions are taught by people who know their stuff, including MSU faculty members, 4-H volunteers and staff members and other experts.
- It's not all sessions! There's plenty of time for fun, including skating, souvenir shopping, exploring, bowling, basketball—even a great dance Thursday night.
- The 2023 cost is \$220. For more information please see the Registration Information page.
 - The fee includes meals, a shared room in a dorm, sessions and a t-shirt. 4-H Scholarship funds are available.
- Registration opens March 21st, 2023. You will be asked to put \$50 down as a deposit.
 Registration books that show all of the sessions and details on everything happening during Exploration Days will be available online and from county Extension offices in by the end of February. Booklets will be taken to all of our county schools now that the sessions list is released, including the scholarship application form and the bus form.
- Registration deadline will be at the end of April. Don't wait until the deadline though, because popular sessions fill up fast!

Leelanau County 4-H Babysitting Club Members are Just About to Graduate!



Our Leelanau County 4-H Babysitting Club has met 3 times already, and what a wonderful group of youth! We have 18 young folks from all over the county, and Grand Traverse County, too, representing five of our local schools! The first two of the last three weeks were dedicated to learning CPR and First Aid, under the instruction of Lieutenant Josh Porter from the Suttons Bay Bingham Fire and Rescue Station. Josh taught them skills to help them respond in a helpful way during an emergency. They will walk away with a 2-year certification from the American Heart Association.

As we finish out the club, the students will learn many things about safety, crafts, snack-making, the ages and stages of babies and kids, and just what it takes to be a great babysitter. We will do everything from practicing how to read aloud to role-playing different babysitting scenarios. By the end, they will have received handouts to add to their curriculum binders and things to take with them to add to their babysitting bags, including creating their very own first aid kits for emergencies. They will even practice how to advertise safely that they are certified to be babysitters! We will celebrate their accomplishments with a graduation, and each youth will receive a certificate and pin. Thank you, in our sixth year of providing this program, for being a great partner, Suttons Bay Bingham Fire and Rescue! And thank you to co-leader Kathy Swinney and teen leader Isabelle Plamondon for their tremendous help and work on making this a great program for our 4-H'ers!

Apply for the Michigan 4-H State Awards!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards

(13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.
