Fair 2022!

This year's Northwestern Michigan Fair was a big success, with seven of our Leelanau 4-H livestock clubs attending: Frontier Quest, Gotta Lluva Cool Critter, Happy Hooves, Lake Ann 4-H Cattle Club, Proclites, Small Town Farmers, and Two by Two. We had 20 4-H adult volunteers and 76 4-H youth in attendance from our Leelanau County 4-H program, and it took everyone's focus and effort to help make this year a great one! We are always proud of our clubs and how they represent the four H's: Head, Heart, Hands, and Health, with their quick-thinking and clear problem-solving, deep level of caring for others (animals and people), hard work throughout the year and especially fair week, and making sure that everyone in their club is healthy and that their animals and barn spaces are kept clean and organized. Our county clubs won four barn awards this year: a sign of dedication, great care, and showing a positive presence in the barn. This is a great honor, and an amazing one, since Leelanau has only 7 of the over 60 clubs that come to fair each summer.

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Fair 2022 continued



The 4-H auction brought in over one million dollars, a recordbreaking total. An example of the generosity of our local buyers was shared by one of our 4-H youth, JC Oosse, who sold his production pen of chickens for \$60 a pound to a buyer (for over \$1300 total), a record high for him and his club. It is a hard thing to focus solely on the higher-level ribbons and Grand Champion and Reserve banners when you can walk through each of the barns at fair and easily see our Leelanau 4-H'ers in action, and their many ribbons posted by their animals. Their decorations show their great enthusiasm, with photos depicting smiling faces and fun facts about their projects and how much care they gave them in the months leading up to fair. Their pens and cages are clean, their animals are cared for, they are present and smiling and speak with visitors clearly, and they are helpful. Many of our youth also show in multiple barns and have extraordinary knowledge of multiple species of animals and poultry. I also can't say enough about our 4-H volunteersthey are always there, working with their 4-H families, mentoring their 4-H youth, and helping make things smoother for fair week. When I check in with them, they smile and say they are having a great week, even when there are rivers on the sidewalks from the torrential rain. They talk about how proud they are of their club members.

We also had a great presence in the Tanner Exhibit Building this year, with 4-H cloverbud (ages 5-7) activities and crafts all week long, club booth displays, independent judged projects, and 4-H interviews and demonstrations (including a cloverbud tap dance presentation). Our longstanding volunteer Kathy Swinney puts the cloverbud crafts and activities together for the kids, and loves coming back each year to bring more young children into the program. This year, she also had some help from 4-H teen leader Maddie Gallagher in the planning and prep work. Our new 4-H Tap Dance volunteer, Robin Carden, served as a 4-H interviewer during fair, as did 4-H teen leader Everett Howell. Our 4-H youth took part in all of the extras: farm dog competition, costume classes, 4-H dance, the Showmanship Showdown (highly competitive event for the Grand Champion winners), exhibit building projects, the Differently Abled shows, barn duty, and several of our youth won scholarships and awards in recognition of their above-andbeyond and can-do attitudes. Leelanau 4-H is so very proud of our great accomplishments at this year's fair! 

Leelanau Shooting Sports Are On Target!

Our NW MI 4-H Shooting Sports Club has been meeting regularly out at Myles Kimmerly this fall, and the 26 youth members, along with 4-H leaders Stephanie Steffens and Shelly Roots, have been right on target! The two sessions have been meeting every Wednesday, and are looking forward to their final night of pumpkin targets, candy treats, 4-H giveaways, and getting their 4-H archery club t-shirts! This is a fantastic partnership with our county's Parks and Recreation Committee, as we use the old 4-H horse park space for this outdoor club, free of charge.

New 4-H shooting sports archery leader Joe Blondia has brought back our other archery club in Leelanau held at the Leelanau School: Thunderbirds on Target! The 13 members in the club are all high school students, and chose to take part in this club as an "outdoor arts" experience, combining such experiences as hiking, fly-cast fishing, decoy-painting, and archery. Usually, the group has archery in the winter months, using their Leelanau 4-H archery backdrop curtain, their targets, and new archery equipment. Leelanau 4-H is working with Mr. Blondia to build the club up and support its other pursuits—fishing is the next focus for help with funding and supplies.



It's Time to Re-Enroll in 4HOnline!

The new 4-H year started on September 1st! Please go to your existing family account and re-enroll each member for 2022/2023. No participation fees anymore, so the process is quick! If you are enrolling your youth the first time, you will need to create a family account first, and then add your youth member to that account. Please do not add any adults to the account who have not gone through the volunteer selection process with MSU.





All 4-H Volunteers Need to Complete Steps to Be Active Again

For any 4-H volunteer who is also a club leader, you must contact Rosali to set up a fall leader update meeting. We will get your annual paperwork completed, make sure you have re-enrolled, look at your current club roster, talk about this year, and you will get to choose a thank-you gift for you or a family member. Your club will not be truly active until this is done. We also must have all club Annual Financial Summary Reports filled out and submitted to our office before October 28th. This is a hard deadline this year and must be met. Please reach out with any questions on this. Your annual background check will now be completed through Volunteer Central during your birth month. The system will send you a reminder email to let you know it's time. All 4-H volunteers must complete the Child Abuse Reporting Protocol module in Volunteer Central by the end of December to be active for this year. Let me know if you need help getting this completed.



Officers and By-laws Elections: to be eligible to vote, you (youth and adults) must be pending or active for this year in 4HOnline. All 4-H Livestock Council members are able to vote if they took part in last year's fair and are 4-H age 8 or older. 4-H Volunteers must be active in our system to be eligible to vote, so even if you are a 4-H parent, you must be an "official" volunteer in the system to vote.

Record Books/thank you notes must be turned in or youth will be suspended from this coming fair. Some youth were given their record books back to make changes.

2023 Sponsorship Giveaway: winners will be drawn to receive a project animal or a feed grant! Youth must be present to win.

Many of our Leelanau County 4-H youth were able to take part in them, and even help with their club animals! MSU Extension/Leelanau 4-H partnered with Northwest Educational Services, the Northwest Michigan Horticulture Center, farm market vendors, and our five schools to hold these markets, some outdoors and some indoors (depending on the weather). We had two smoothie bikes, fresh farm produce tasting, a cider press with free apples, free 4-H giveaways and a petting zoo, and more! Amelia Kish Excelled at MSU's Vet Science Camp

Amelia Kish, a member of Hidden Beech Equestrian 4-H Club, attended MSU's Animal and Vet Science Camp, a week-long experience held on campus every summer. Only 50 youth were selected to attend, out of many applicants! This is what she wrote about her experience:

"Michigan State University's Animal and Veterinary Science camp has opened many doors for me as a senior in high school. I had the privilege of meeting many other wonderful students attending the camp from in and out of state with varying animal experiences. This was extremely valuable as I was able to talk with and learn from other students what it is like to show and grow up around all kinds of animals. I have been heavily involved in horses and 4-H for six years ever since I attended a wonderful horse camp led by Eleanor Miller of Hidden Beech Farms.

In MSU's Vet Science Camp I was able to share my horse experiences and gain more information about animals I had never been involved with. I listened to many guest speakers and alumni who shared their experiences in the workforce and the versatility of an Animal Science Degree. Spartan Alumni shared their experiences ranging from an everyday veterinarian to teachers and FDA workers. I was then able to tour MSU's Horse, Dairy Cattle, and Swine Teaching and Research Centers as well as their Beef and Sheep farms bringing to life all of the information and experiences I had heard about. My favorite part of the camp, aside from making many new friends, was watching a calf necropsy and participating in a small group piglet dissection. This camp doesn't just tell you about careers with animals, it allows you to sample all areas of the animal industry. Over the course of the week spent at camp, me and four other campers worked together in case study groups researching different animal ailments and treatment options, which we presented at the end of the week to our peers and parents. This camp allowed me to discover what I enjoyed and disliked about different careers so that I can apply it to my future."
