Third Annual 4-H4ALL and Leelanau County 4-H Awards a Success

We had a wonderful time at the Lions Club in Maple City on January 27th, first with our annual 4-H4ALL event with several local 4-H clubs in attendance, showing everyone what they do. This event was brought back after four years and hosted by the Leelanau County 4-H Youth Association, assisted by several Leelanau County 4-H clubs and 2 Grand Traverse County club leaders. 15 adult volunteers and 16 4-H members helped put on this mini-expo held at the Cedar/Maple City Lions Club in Maple City. We had 38 people attend this outreach event, where each club took part in helping teach an activity or lesson to guests (and to other 4-H youth members). We had a free drawing for anyone who came--everyone walked away with a 4-H prize (or three). The Youth Association also had two teen leaders teaching activities using the Sphero Robots and Apple iPads with A-Mazing Bowling and a message saying welcome to 4-H4ALL. We had clubs who taught guests about the dog project, face painting, cloverbud craft activities with bird house painting, livestock projects (poultry, llama, rabbit) record books, rabbit and poultry showmanship (using a fake chicken because the real ones had mites at home) and an interactive game with the Life Cycle of the Chick, horse projects with tack-cleaning and two types of saddles, as well as a large drawing of a horse with parts labeled, games, and a slideshow of all of our local clubs taking part in 4-H activities and events over the past year. We had free snacks and hot chocolate with marshmallows. People could learn more about 4-H and walk away with 4-H swag and information. Our awards were for our 4-H families afterwards, with project pin awards as well as the larger county-wide awards. We enjoyed pizza and 4-H cookies afterwards, and because the event had been rescheduled due to inclement weather, some youth could not attend. Their club leaders brought them their awards. We also want to thank the Lions Club for hosting us—they do this at no charge, and we love the space!

County 4-H Ski and Snowboard Program Great Fun but Short Season

Sixty-one 4-H Youth (including three teen chaperones) and six 4-H Volunteers took part in the Leelanau County 4-H Ski and Snowboard Program at The Homestead Resort in Glen Arbor this winter. The program took place just one day in January, rather than the planned four days, due to a lack of snow and the need for the resort to cancel the program. This was a very sad outcome for us, after working hard to bring it back. Youth attended a one-hour lesson with a Homestead instructor and at least one 4-H chaperone, and then had the chance to ski or snowboard for the remaining four hours with their families. The 4-H volunteers took part in the program by filling a chaperone role, assisting the resort's certified instructors during the lessons. Families were reimbursed for 75% of their registration fees. We also sent the 4-H Ski and Snowboard ribbon and a personalized note to each youth after the cancellation, thanking them for their participation, since we weren't able to hold our usual hot chocolate/cookie/ribbon celebration at the end of the program. Leelanau County 4-H hats were mailed to every volunteer and instructor with a thank-you. We couldn't do this program without our volunteers! We hope to run a modified version of the program again next year, and hopefully our winter weather will cooperate with us!



















4-H TRACTOR SAFETY PROGRAM

For 14 and 15 Year Old Youth

Teens can improve their chances of employment this summer by completing a tractor safety training course!

Successful completion of a tractor operation safety course is required for all youth under the age of 16 who perform farm jobs classified as hazardous, under the U.S. Department of Labor's Hazardous Occupation Order.

To become certified, participants must attend all three course meetings, & pass an in-person written test and tractor driving test.

Who: Leelanau 4-H will host this training for 14 & 15 Year Old Youth. Youth must be age 14 by June 1st. 2024. Space is limited! (16-19 year olds are encouraged to participate, but priority is given to 14-15 year olds). Class curriculum follows Gearing Up for Safety: Production Agriculture Safety Training for Youth

Where: NW MI Horticulture Research Center, 6686 S. Center Hwy., Traverse City. (County Road 633 between Suttons Bay & Traverse City)

When: Sundays, May 5th, May 19th & June 2nd, from 3-5 p.m. An in-person written and driving test will be given on Sunday, June 9th* by appointment between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. (using SignUp Genius)

(*Rain date will be Saturday, June 15th.)

Cost: \$60 per person - includes: classes, manual, certificate, and snackon test day. Some scholarships are available if finances are an issue.

Leelanau County 4-H Tractor Safety Opens for Registration Friday, March 1st!

Teens can improve their chances of employment by completing a tractor safety training. Extension/Leelanau 4-H will host an in-person 4-H Tractor Safety Program for 14 and 15-year-old youth on Sundays, May 5, May 19, and June 2 from 3:00-5:00 pm at the NW MI Horticulture Research Center (between Suttons Bay and Traverse City on County Rd 633). The written and driving test will be held inperson, by appointment, on Sunday, June 9 between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Rain date will be Saturday. June 15. Participants must attend all four days to become certified. The cost is \$60 per student, which includes the classes, manual, certificate, and snack on testing day. Scholarships are available if finances are an issue. Youth must be 14 years of age by June 1, 2024. Space is limited to 20 youth. The registration deadline is April 26, 2024. Registration is online-only in a two-step process. First, register and pay (starting March 1st) at https://events.anr.msu.edu/TractorSafety2024/ and second, become a 4-H member with Leelanau County and create a family account online at https://v2.4honline.com/ choosing the Tractor Safety program as their club. Once registered, participants will receive more information about signing up for the testing day. 

Registration is open for 4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resource Camp!

4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resources Camp is an annual three-time national award-winning camp that mixes summer fun and hands-on science education. The camp will be held July 28 - August 3 on the shores of Lake Esau at Camp Chickagami in Presque Isle. This pre-college program is for teens who will be age 13 to 15 during camp.

Campers will increase their science literacy and stewardship as they learn from natural resource experts in fields such as Great Lakes coastal and fisheries management, limnology, wildlife, forestry, geography, geology and environmental education. In addition to hands-on learning, attendees will also enjoy exciting natural resources recreation activities such as kayaking, snorkeling, sailing, fossil hunting, archery, photography and evenings around a campfire. First-time campers also go charter fishing and learn to fillet their catch.



Registration is now open! The registration fee is \$500 and includes six nights of lodging, all meals and snacks, a t-shirt and program and activity costs.
