### **Free Cloverbud Activities**

Monday through Friday of Fair Week, with two hours each morning from 10:00-noon, and then again each afternoon from 2-4:00 pm. Each day we will have different craft activities and a free prize drawing (a cloverbud bag full of goodies). Youth may win a cloverbud prize drawing one time during fair week. Saturday the 12th will be our Cloverbud Games, under and near the DA Tent, starting at 4:00 pm. This year, we will have several activities and games, a couple of simple crafts, and prizes to take. We hope you will join us for our fun and free make-and-take! A big thank-you to our 4-H Cloverbud Chair, Kathy Swinney, and the clubs who have volunteered to be on the committee.

#### **Tanner Building**

We have several club booth displays this year telling their 4-H story, and competing for Best Club Booth Display 2023. A big thank-you goes out to our local 4-H clubs who helped out and provided the livestock projects for our 4-H petting zoo at the NW MI Horticulture Research Center during Cherry Festival in July. We enjoyed hosting Lone Wolves, Frontier Quest, and Backyard Bunch, with extra appearances by Amanda King and her children, Linda Oosse and her son JC, and Isabelle Plamondon providing animals on two days that we didn't have full petting zoos in place. We also had the wonderful cloverbud activities and crafts provided by Kathy Swinney. We also had the help of Everett Howell of our Leelanau County 4-H Youth Association, who ran a booth for two of the days with an Apple iPad STEAM trivia game, and helped kids win prizes after they dropped a plinko chip to find out what trivia question they would get to answer. There were questions for a variety of age levels. We had chickens, rabbits, goats, and bake sales, too! We also had fun coloring books focusing on the cherry industry and 4-H projects, temporary tattoos (cherries), stickers, pens, and pencils for everyone. The weather was wonderful all week, and it was great fun to visit with the public, talk about 4-H, and see our 4-H clubs do what they do so well: share their knowledge and give their time to others. We reached over 300 people over the four days with our cloverbud and STEAM trivia games, and more than that (over 500) visited with the animals. ### 2023 Michigan 4-H State Award winners announced

The <u>Michigan 4-H State Awards</u> Program recognized outstanding 4-H members during the opening session of 4-H Exploration Days on June 22. At the event, honorees had the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments with their fellow 4-H Exploration Days participants.

A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on Michigan 4-H members and recognizes a level of excellence in learning, leadership and service. In total, 22 4-H members from 15 counties submitted applications to take part is this year's program.

"All of our 4-H'ers across the state are amazing but the youth honored

with 4-H State Awards are some of our most accomplished," said Julie Chapin, state 4-H leader for Michigan and director of MSU Extension's children and youth programs. "They have demonstrated their dedication to improving themselves and their communities through 4-H, service and more."

Michigan 4-H State Awards were presented in 13 of the 20 available award categories that showcase the diverse array of 4-H knowledge, skills and experience. Recipients of the 2023 awards are:

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is open to 4-H members who are 13-19 years old with three or more years of 4-H experience. To qualify for the award, 4-H'ers must submit a written application that showcases the learning experiences, knowledge and skills they've acquired through their participation in 4-H, as well as their contributions to their local 4-H programs, clubs and communities. Submissions are reviewed by the Michigan 4-H State Awards selection committee. This group of volunteers, staff members and industry experts determine which members are selected as award finalists. All applicants receive written feedback from selection committees.

In addition to a plaque, each 4-H State Award winner in the senior division will also receive a \$200 cash award; junior winners receive \$50 cash awards. These awards are made possible by generous donations to the Michigan 4-H Foundation.
