4-H Exploration Days 2022: Explore Your Spark! June 22-24

4-H Exploration Days will be open for registration starting on Thursday, April 14th, at 7:00 pm (to allow families to register after working hours). Leelanau County youth are invited to join over 1,000 young people for three



days of fun, adventure and learning at 4-H **Exploration Days** 2022. "Find Your Spark" is the theme for this annual 4-H event, held Wednesday, June 22 through Friday, June 24 on the campus of Michigan

State University. We hope that you will join us this year — just be registered as a current 4-H youth and be part of our delegation! Don't miss the excitement on MSU's campus! From magic to spa science, or fused glass to dog grooming, participants may take part in sessions that are suited to the interests of everyone--choose from over 100 different actionpacked options! When not involved with their learning sessions, students may experience recreation and MSU facility tour choices such as the MSU Breslin **Center, Demmer Center, National** Superconducting Cyclotron Laboratory, and the 4-H Children's Garden. Participants must be at least 12 years old by January 1, 2022.

The event is sponsored by the Michigan 4-H Program, but participants do not need to be a current 4-H member to attend. So, invite a friend to join you! Parents and 4-H volunteers are invited, too!

The fee to attend as a youth is \$220 and includes 2 nights lodging, 7 meals, an event Tshirt, and the learning option(s) of your choice (a few options have age restrictions). It also includes optional recreational activities like skating, bowling, a dance, and other fun evening activities.

Transportation to and from campus is provided via school buses for a small fee. Registration will be online in a new system this year, with a \$50 deposit. (All adult chaperones may use a coupon provided by Rosali so that their registration is fully covered.) You can pay by cash, credit card, or check. Depending on the payment option, follow the below instructions: o If paying by electronic check or credit card, you may apply payment of the \$50.00 deposit directly to your registration upon submission. If paying by check or cash, you will need to contact our Leelanau 4-H Office prior to registering to receive the 2022 coupon code and to submit payment.

The registration link will be open as of April 14th at 7:00 pm on the Exploration Days website. Early registration is strongly encouraged as many sessions fill quickly, and there are only 1000 spots for youth this year. You can pick an A and B session with a D session OR choose a C session and D session. A helpful trick is to pick a few choices in case your favorite is full. Sessions may have age limits, may be repeated at a different time (noted with an asterisk), or have special considerations for dress or prework so read the descriptions closely. There will be an orientation on May 26th for all participants and their parents.

Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience



4-H Capitol Experience Youth Summit was a 2-day hybrid version of the usual 4day in-person experience in Lansing. The teens met via Zoom on Sunday, March 20, and then they had the choice to attend in person in Lansing or via Zoom on Wednesday, March 23. Out of 30 youth from the entire state, Leelanau County 4-H had two youth in attendance. They had a very busy and engaging agenda, many guest speakers (including senators, state rep-

resentatives, tribal leaders, and legislators), and trained youth facilitators who took the lead in different breakout groups for this event. Leelanau County had two 4-H members attend: Everett Howell, a 9th grade student at Greenspire High School and

Patrick Sutherland, a 9th grade student at The Leelanau School. Everett said, "I really liked my issue group and all that we talked about (wind and solar energy and policies in Michigan). It was really cool to go to the Capitol Building, take photos, and visit with some of the senators and have them listen to what I was saying. I liked meeting Senator VanderWall, and he said that he would be happy to help me with any projects I could think of in Leelanau. I think I would like to help with next year's event,

and I am really excited about it being more than one day down in Lansing." Everett was offered the opportunity to reach out directly to both his representative and his senator to ask them to join the group at the legislative reception, and he emailed them both, and had responses from both. 4-H Capitol Experience allows our local teens to take part in a highlymeaningful leadership event in our state capitol. Scholarships are always available through Leelanau 4-H for this event.

Leelanau County 4-H Babysitting Club: Responsible Leaders

Our Babysitting Club met five times in January and February, and our 20 participants were able to complete their CPR/First Aid Certification through the American Heart Association, thanks to Josh Porter of the Suttons Bay Bingham Fire and Rescue Station and our five-year partnership with the station. I had a wonderful co-leader, Kathy Swinney, who worked with me to run the snacks, crafts, and activities smoothly. Picture 20 young people making slime, all at the same time, and you get the picture. Glue. Glitter. Food coloring! Kathy is also our Cloverbud Chair for the 4-H Livestock Council, and is used to working with groups of young people having fun with hands-on activities. We also had the assistance of Everett Howell, who served in a teen leader role for the second year in a row with the club. He helped facilitate discussions, shared personal insights, and demonstrated everything from

how to hold an infant to what they would put in their babysitting "magic bag". The youth got to know each other very well by the end of the club, as they had worked as partners to create snacks, crafts, role play, and diaper and hold doll babies. Everyone took turns talking, sharing their ideas and questions, and it was an engaging group. One of the things we talked about in our babysitting club was safety, especially sharing personal information about yourself on social media. This group of young people did a fantastic job participating and I think they will all do very well if they choose to work with children in the future. **Congratulations!**

4-H Exploration Days is designed to help youth build the skills they need to successfully transition to college and to life as an adult. Michigan 4-H youth who participate have the opportunity to stay in MSU campus residence halls while attending classroom and field trip sessions throughout their stay.

With more than 100 session choices held on and off campus, there are topics for everyone including animal science, business and entrepreneurship, international language and culture, performing and visual arts, and science, engineering, and technology. As youth gain important life skills like decision making, problem solving and communication, they'll also have plenty of time for fun with free time activities such as skating, bowling, basketball and a dance.
