2023 Horse Judging and Horse Hippology Teams Forming Now! You Do Not Need to Own a Horse to Participate.

Winter is the perfect time to study up on your horse knowledge and meet up with fellow horse and horseless project 4-H members. Practices and farm visits started December 28th, but there is still time to join!

Horse Judging teaches what judges look for in conformation (halter) and performance (riding) classes. This is great information to know for youth participating in horse projects or if you ever shop for a horse of your own. The practice contest is February 3-4, and The Michigan 4-H/FFA Horse Judging Contest is April 16. Horse Hippology is the study of all horse-related knowledge, including judging, anatomy, breeds, colors,



care, equipment, health and welfare, and riding disciplines. The Michigan 4-H Hippology Contest is March 18.

What are Our 4-H Committees and What Do They Do?

As we have many families and members new to 4-H, we want to remind new and experienced 4-H'ers of the opportunities available at our 4-H Committee meetings.

In our county, we have the following committees that provide opportunities for youth and volunteers to have their voices heard and participate in leadership positions. We encourage all of our youth and leaders to attend one or more of these meetings:

- **4-H Council:** The 4-H Council assists in planning, helping, advising and promoting the Livingston County 4-H youth program. The 4-H Council has opportunities for adult officers and youth to serve in junior officer roles.
- Animal Project Committee: This committee recently formed combining both large and small animal project areas and is open to any youth, parents, or volunteers who are active or interested in these projects areas. This committee also helps with livestock clinics.



- Horse Association: The purpose of the Horse Association is to support fun and educational activities for 4-H members of Livingston County in the area of horse & pony using the Michigan 4-H guiding principles. This committee has youth officers and adult advisors.
- Therapeutic Riding Program Committee: This committee's purpose is to enrich the lives of children with disabilities residing in Livingston County and beyond (county residents given first priority) through the Grand Equestrians therapeutic horseback riding program. This committee only has adult officers.

Resolve to have a great 4-H year

As we start to think ahead to the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

Resolve that:

- 1. Club meetings will start and end on time.
- 2. Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
- 3. All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
- 4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
- 5. Fun will be included in each meeting.
- 6. A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
- 7. The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
- 8. New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H guestions.
- 9. The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
- 10. Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.
